

Teen fights murder charge

A Westland teen who pumped 20 assault rifle bullets into a stolen car, killing the driver, shouldn't face murder charges, a defense attorney said Thursday.

At most, Thomas Robert Wood-

A defense attorney says his client shouldn't be charged with murder in a case in which a Westland man was killed in a shooting following a traffic dispute. Judge Gail McKnight will rule if the defendant should be tried and, if so, on what charges.

head, 18, should face manslaughter charges for the slaying of 24-year-old Antonio Fillippo Maggio, who initiated an earlier traffic dispute that led to his own death, attorney Samuel Gardner said.

Gardner's statements came during Woodhead's preliminary hearing in

Westland 18th District Court. Judge Gail McKnight is expected to rule Friday whether Woodhead should stand trial — and on what charges.

Following Maggio's death at 7:28 p.m. Feb. 27 on a residential street near Wayne Road and Palmer, Woodhead was charged with second-degree murder and felony firearms. He could face life in prison if convicted. Manslaughter, however, carries a 15-year term.

McKnight delayed her ruling to consider arguments from Gardner and Wayne County assistant pro-

secutor Tom Trizinski, who argued that the murder charge should stand.

During testimony Thursday, witnesses described a bizarre, plot-twisting chain of events that ended in Maggio's slaying in the 2300 block of Christine. In fact, Woodhead wasn't involved in an initial traffic dispute that led to the killing, witnesses said.

The traffic altercation began after Maggio left a Westland bar and began riding south on Wayne Road in a van with two friends, Matthew Krejci and

Firefighters drain leaking fuel tank

Westland firefighters drained a 20,000-gallon gasoline storage tank Saturday afternoon after nearly 2,000 gallons leaked through a small hole.

The action caused traffic jams throughout the day as firefighters from Westland and neighboring communities drained the storage

tank, one of four at the Feister Oil Co. site on the west side of Newburgh, north of Ford.

The Westland fire department was aided by the Western Wayne County Hazardous Materials Response Team and a Metro Airport squad, which brought a foam-spraying truck to the site.

Proposal A survey fizzles; only 3 respond

There will be a close vote on Proposal A in Westland Tuesday — if only three people vote.

Of a mere three respondents to our telephone survey, two were in favor and one opposed.

OK, so maybe the results are inconclusive. Here's what the opinionated three had to say.

One caller said he will vote for the proposal because "it's an honest at-

tempt" by Gov. John Engler to spread the tax burden.

Another backer commented that his overall taxes will be less under Proposal A than under the backup statutory plan.

One upset resident made it clear that he is opposed to the proposal because it provides additional money for schools which don't need it.

day, the caller urged others to challenge the statutory plan in court.

Voters are reminded to go to voting locations used in municipal, state and national elections, not ones used in school elections.

Proposal A would increase the state sales tax to 6 percent from 4 percent, raise the state cigarette tax to 75 cents a pack from 25 cents, and reduce the state income tax rate to 4.4

percent from 4.6 percent.

Key to the plan is a slashing of school operating property taxes to 6 mills on primary residences and 24 mills on all other property.

If voters don't approve the plan, an already-approved backup, statutory plan goes into effect.

In that plan, the income tax rate would be raised to 6 percent with a higher personal exemption.

Barnaby is a graduate of Wayne State University, where he earned a bachelor's degree in journalism.



Four young men charged in separate sex assaults

Two young men accused in separate Westland incidents have been ordered to stand trial amid allegations they forced 13-year-old girls to have sex with them.

Jamie Kendall Bell, 17, of Westland and Marvin Maurice Paschall, 20, of Inkster face separate trials on charges of criminal sexual conduct.

In two other unrelated incidents:

■ A 21-year-old Dearborn Heights man has been ordered to stand trial amid allegations he sexually molested a 13-year-old boy in Westland.

■ A 17-year-old Westland boy was arraigned Friday in 18th District Court on charges of having sex with a 13-year-old girl.

Bell is accused of inviting a 13-year-old girl into a bedroom to talk during a Feb. 26 party on St. Joe Street, near Newburgh and Palmer, said Westland police Sgt. Michael Terry. The girl has accused Bell of forcing her to have sex with him during the 11:30 p.m. incident, Terry said.

Bell also has been accused of making other threats against the girl, Terry said. The defendant remained in jail late last week in lieu of a \$25,000 cash bond.

Bell has waived a preliminary hearing in 18th District Court and has been bound over for trial in Detroit Recorder's Court. He could face up to 15 years in prison if convicted of third-degree criminal sexual conduct, Terry said.

In a similar but unrelated incident, Paschall is accused of asking a 13-year-old girl into a bathroom during a Dec. 27 party in the 700 block of Forest, near Wildwood and Cherry Hill, Terry said.

The girl has accused Paschall of forcing her to have sex with him during the 1 a.m. incident, Terry said.

Paschall has waived a preliminary hearing and, like Bell, has been bound over for trial in Recorder's Court. He could face up to 15 years in prison if convicted of third-degree criminal sexual conduct.

In the incident involving the boy, 21-year-old Stephen Henry Trimmer Jr. of Dearborn Heights faces trial amid allegations he fondled a 13-year-old boy at a Joy Road residence in Westland, Sgt. Laura Moore said.

The incident allegedly occurred after a party had ended at the residence, Moore said. Trimmer has been accused of fondling the boy during the late hours of Feb. 12 and the early hours of Feb. 13, she said.

Trimmer has waived a preliminary hearing and faces trial for fourth-degree criminal sexual conduct, punishable by up to two years in prison. He remained in jail last week in lieu of a \$20,000/10 percent bond.

In the latest charges, Jamie Velez, 17, of Westland was arraigned Friday on charges of having sex with a 13-year-old girl in the 8200 block of Valley View, Terry said.

Police capture suspect in jewel theft

A jewel thief grabbed two diamond-and-gold tennis bracelets worth \$17,650 from a jewelry store employee at Westland Center last week, but police have since captured a suspect.

The male suspect was expected to be arraigned during the week-end, said Sgt. Jay Deschenes of the Westland Police Department. The incident occurred shortly

before 10:30 a.m. Tuesday when a man walked into Helzberg Diamonds and pretended to be shopping for the expensive bracelets, police reports said.

The man asked to see two bracelets — one valued at \$11,150 and another valued at \$6,500, police reports said. When the 40-year-old female employee showed the jewelry to the man, he grabbed both bracelets and fled from the mall, police said.

When the woman screamed "Stop him," a Canton Township man shopping in the mall chased after the man and saw him getting into a Dodge Shadow, the reports said. The man provided information that helped Westland police make an arrest.

The woman described the suspect as a 5-foot-10 black male, about 28 years old and weighing approximately 175 pounds. She reported that the suspect also had short cropped hair.

The leak was reported about 8:45 a.m. when about 500 gallons was observed on the ground next to one of four storage tanks. Soon, about 2,000 gallons leaked before a 3-inch hole near the bottom of the tank was plugged. The hole was created by corrosion, said battalion chief William Green, spokesman for the units at the site.

Large patches of peeling paint were visible on the tank.

A 2-foot-high containing wall surrounding the storage tanks kept the gasoline from spreading.

Green reported at noon that the firefighters had controlled the leak. Soon afterwards, they

drained the remaining 18,000 gallons. Some of it was put in a storage tanker and put in the city public service department's underground storage tank, said Mark Neal, also a battalion chief, who headed the more than 30 firefighters at the scene.

The leak was first observed by a Feister employee who called veteran Feister truck driver Bob Richey at home. After the fire department was called, Richey stood across the street at a Marathon gasoline station to watch firefighters contain the leak and drain the tank.

Richey said he didn't know the age of the leaking tank, but said it was built before he joined the

firm. "It was something that just happened," he said.

Green said area businesses and homeowners were notified of the leak, but there was no evacuation.

The leak was initially plugged

by a stick placed in the hole. About 11 a.m., the hazardous materials team finished plugging the leak, Green said.

Also assisting the Westland department were firefighters from Canton Township and the city of Wayne.

Mayor vows to improve relations with business

Mayor Robert Thomas, who battled local business persons early in his administration, says he wants to improve communication and let them know that his administration wants to help solve problems.

To launch the new program, called "Good Morning Westland," the mayor has scheduled the first of a series of breakfast meetings for 7:30 a.m. Tuesday, March 22.

He plans to hold about three similar breakfast meetings in the next 12 months.

Mayoral assistant George Gillies said he thought up with the name of the program, which he said was patterned after the "Good Morning America" TV program.

"I want to formulate a better working relationship between the administration and the business community," the mayor said in an interview last week. "Some business persons feel the administration isn't listening to them."

Bu, Thomas said, he wants to "open up a good dialogue" with local business persons.

The mayor, first elected in late 1989, ran into several highly publicized disputes with the Westland Chamber of Commerce early in his administration. When he was campaigning for a second

term last fall, chamber leaders openly supported his opponent, city council president Charles Pickering.

Thomas was re-elected by nearly a 2-1 margin.

"We will deal with them (businesses) directly, show them that we care, that we want to listen to their problems and ask them that we can do to help them," Thomas said.

The first of a series of meetings will focus on companies in the city's several industrial parks. Specifically, Thomas hopes to have industrial firms upgrade the appearance of their sites.

That session will be followed by meetings with retailers, professional persons, and small business owners.

At next Tuesday morning's session with industrial company representatives, the administration will discuss a Michigan business expansion and retention program and how various tax reform proposals will affect the firms.

Among the speakers will be Michael Gorman, the city's finance director, and Cynthia Faulhaber, an attorney with the firm of Miller, Canfield, Paddock and Stone.

Specific city administrators will attend the breakfast meetings to answer questions that relate to their departments.

Scott Veldhuis, the city's economic development director, said that in April the municipal economic development corporation will start a major program to survey local businesses as part of the business expansion and retention program.

A similar survey was made in 1985 to pinpoint how local companies feel about the community and specific issues relating to the city government.

The program will take eight to 10 months, Veldhuis said.

Besides the quarterly breakfast meetings, Thomas said informational newsletters from the administration will be sent to local businesses every three months.

There are about 1,000 businesses in the city, of which about 150 are industrial firms, Veldhuis said.

Scholarship winners are on 'Target'

The scholarships recognize and reward outstanding volunteer community service by youth. Students ages 15-18 were eligible to enter the competition. Winners were chosen by a judging panel made up of community representatives.

Kucka demonstrated outstanding community service through her work with the Junior Civilians, Special Olympics and the

homeless. Touchstone's service stemmed from her volunteer work in pediatrics at Garden City Hospital, as a camp counselor and as a church volunteer, a press release said.

The scholarships will be presented by Mayor Robert Thomas and Target store manager Matt Thomas (no relation). Winners also will receive \$100 to donate to a nonprofit organization of their choice, in addition to a Target Good Neighbor Volunteer T-shirt.

Irish Rovers annoy hosts

The Irish Rovers got their usual rave reviews from fans when they performed March 10 at the Southfield Pavilion, but their traditional pub songs and ethnic chatter weren't everyone's cup of green beer.

All three Southfield councilwomen, Suzanne Goldstein, Vicki Goldbaum and Joan Seymour found the Rovers' performance offensive — to women and to people from other cultures.

Goldstein said she was particularly upset over one incident in the show in which they insulted Japanese in the audience by deliberately mispronouncing the words in a song. "When I looked over and noticed Japanese visitors sitting at the table next to me, I wanted to crawl under it," Goldstein said.

"I'm writing a letter to tell them that they were completely insensitive, inappropriate and way out of line," she added.

"I love the Irish Rovers music," Seymour said, "but I also was offended. They sing old barroom songs and I doubt that they mean any harm. I was offended that the city would sponsor this type of presentation."

Said Goldbaum: "I understand that they're barroom songs, but this is a diverse community." She'd have them back again, she said, but would remind them to be sensitive to everyone in the audience.

Goldstein started the discussion at the March 7 city council meeting, the first following the Rovers' third annual show sponsored by the city's department of parks and recreation. The men on council didn't complain.

"What we were seeing were Irish people performing what was Irish culture," said councilman Peter Cristiano.

Attempts to reach the Vancouver-based Rovers or their spokesman for comment were unsuccessful.

A sellout crowd of more than 700 watched the performance in the pavilion which was arranged with tables and chairs into a giant Irish pub, cash bar and all.

The group, which appears all over the world, always draws a big crowd when it comes to Southfield.

"It was a great concert and the crowd gave them a standing ovation at the end," said Jef Farland, parks and recreation director.

Darren Swindlehurst. Krejci was driving, and Maggio was in the front passenger seat, said Swindlehurst, who was in the back seat.

The trio became upset because a Camaro in front of them — driven by 17-year-old Ryan Revoir — was driving too slowly, Swindlehurst testified. Revoir, a stranger to the men, was accompanied by his girlfriend.

Actions described

Krejci began blowing his van's horn and flashing his headlights at Revoir, who began driving even slower, Swindlehurst said.

At the Wayne-Palmer traffic light, Maggio got out of the van and went over to the passenger door of Revoir's Camaro, yelling and grabbing Revoir's girlfriend by the neck, Revoir testified.

Frightened, Revoir pulled away and drove to a June Street residence to seek help from Woodhead, who lived there with John Hollis. Revoir testified that he left his Camaro running while he and his girlfriend went to the front door for help.

In the meantime, the three men in the van had followed Revoir to June Street, and Maggio got out of the van and stole the Camaro, Swindlehurst said. Swindlehurst and Krejci drove away from the dispute at this point, though Swindlehurst, a Christine Street resident, later heard the shooting.

As Maggio drove off in the stolen car, Revoir, Woodhead and Hollis ran out of Hollis' house

toting two AR-15 assault rifles, and they got into Woodhead's 1982 Mustang and began following Maggio, Hollis testified. Revoir's girlfriend stayed behind.

When the Mustang pulled behind Maggio on Christine Street, Maggio suddenly put the Camaro in reverse "and slammed into us," Hollis said.

Woodhead and Hollis, armed with assault rifles, got out of the Mustang. Revoir, unarmed, started to go for his car and admitted in court that he told Maggio, "I'm going to kill you. You stole my car."

Shooting recalled

Hollis never fired shots; in fact, his weapon wasn't loaded. But Woodhead opened fire with his fully loaded, 32-shot assault rifle when Maggio began backing up again and swerving toward Woodhead, Hollis testified.

"The car was coming toward him," said Hollis, who heard the shots begin.

"It was boom, boom, boom!" he said, adding that he heard about 20 shots.

Maggio, who had no weapon, had been trying to drive away, but after he was shot, the Camaro slowed down and veered onto a lawn, Revoir said.

"I saw this guy bounce around (when the bullets hit him), and then he leaned forward," Revoir said.

When the gunfire ended, Woodhead and Hollis left in the Mustang and went home, where Woodhead took apart the gun and hid it, Hollis said. Revoir stayed by his car. When he looked inside, he saw that Maggio was dead.

"His face was all bloody," Revoir said.

He asked a Christine Street resident to phone the police. Woodhead was subsequently arrested and charged with murder.

Woodhead remains jailed, and bond has been denied. His attorney asked Judge McKnight to set a bond Thursday, but she refused.

As a footnote, McKnight noted that — just three days before the shooting — Woodhead had been placed on probation for possession of an illegal weapon.

State senator opposes additional public boat launches

Sen. Mat Dunaskiss, R-Lake Orion, is mobilizing lakefront property owners to oppose more state-owned public boat launches.

"The Department of Natural Resources claims it uses criteria in picking sites," said Dunaskiss. "I think their policy is: If they can find land, they try to purchase it."

Dunaskiss also is eyeing a moratorium on state launch site purchases.

Michigan United Conservation Clubs is "very much opposed to that attitude," said executive di-

rector Tom Washington.

"The lakes belong to the public. They belong to the people. The fish belong to the people. Yet they'll want the state to stock their lake and maintain a fishery."

"His effort is clearly in response to his constituents who don't want the great unwashed public out there. Oakland County is notorious for that—I've got mine" attitude. But you'll see a dock with eight, 10, 12 different boats that belong to the owner's brother, nephew and uncle," said Washington. He recalled past "ra-

cial overtones" in the 25-year-old issue.

Dunaskiss will chair a subcommittee of the Senate Natural Resources Committee to develop criteria for boat launches and put them into law. "We want to hold a

public hearing in Oakland County and another in the west part of the state," the senator said.

Subcommittee members will include Sen. David Hongiman, R-West Bloomfield, who represents the western lakes districts of Oak-

land County, and Sen. Chris Dingell, D-Trenton, known for pro-hunter legislation.

"We want to put together some kind of weighted formula. What is the usage of a lake? How many homes are there? Is there already public access? How deep is the lake?" Dunaskiss said.

He told of an Oakland sheriff's marine patrol boat being damaged twice when it hit stumps in a shallow lake.

DNR boat launches in Oakland County are on Middle Straits Lake, Commerce Township;

Proud Lake near Wixom; Heron, Holly, Crooked, Crystal, Holdredge and Wildwood-Valley lakes in the Holly Recreation Area; and Graham Lake (south) and Trout Lake, in the Bald Mountain Recreation Area.

Other boat launches are operated by the state Waterways Commission, which issues a separate entry pass; Huron-Clinton Metropolitan State Park; and Oakland County.



Husband expected to recover

A businessman shot by his wife while he slept was expected to be released from the hospital over the weekend, according to a relative.

Lewis Ansara, 41, of Farmington Hills, was removed from intensive care and was taken off a ventilator last week. He's expected to make a full recovery from two gunshot wounds he suffered March 3.

He and relatives own several Big Boy Restaurants in the area, including Westland and Garden City.

Following the shooting of her husband, Leila Ansara, 29, died after turning the gun on herself. She was suffering from depression

since the birth of their fourth child, family members said.

"That's what we understand, but we don't have the whole story yet," said Victor Ansara, a cousin of Lewis Ansara. "We don't have specific records or anything like that. To be quite honest, that's the speculation we've received from what various people have told us."

"We haven't talked too much to Lou about it. We don't want to bother him too much about it now."

Lewis Ansara was interviewed by Farmington Hills police Tuesday at Botsford Hospital. Inspector Thomas Godwin said it sounds like depression did have a role in the attempted murder and suicide. Police are no longer in-

vestigating.

"We've pretty much closed it now," Godwin said. "She did shoot him and took her own life. That's as far as we go."

Godwin said Leila Ansara was not believed to have been taking antidepressants, though police have not received a toxicology report. Antidepressants are often used in treating postpartum depression.

The couple's four children, ages 4, 3, 2 and 8 months are staying with relatives, Victor Ansara said. He has visited Lewis Ansara in the hospital.

"Of course, he's down and he's upset about what happened. Right now, his main concern is the kids and him recovering himself."

Physicist expects big bang when comet slams Jupiter

When a big comet strikes Jupiter in July, the explosion will be greater than that of all of Earth's nuclear weapons.

University of Michigan astrophysicist Guy Worthey described scientists' predictions for the event, before an area service club last week.

"It will happen for five and a half days, these chunks will rain down on the southern face of Jupiter," Worthey said.

To demonstrate how rare it is

for a comet to strike a planet, Worthey said the event is comparable to one though to have happened 65 million years ago when a comet struck the Earth, wiping out the dinosaurs.

While both the Hubble telescope and the Galileo spacecraft, on its way to Jupiter, will record the event, hobbyists' small telescopes "should be able to detect changes," he said.

The comet, Shoemaker-Levy 9, was discovered by Carolyn and Gene Shoemaker and David Levy in March 1993 with the Schmidt

telescope on Mt. Palomar.

When discovered, the comet had already broken into at least 21 large pieces strung out along its orbital path around Jupiter.

The pieces will hit Jupiter starting July 16 at speeds of 37 miles per second, disintegrating with a bang below Jupiter's cloud tops with tens of millions of megatons of explosive energy.

The impact is predicted to be 20 degrees south of Jupiter's great red spot.



S'craft students tutor Detroit kids

Students at the Inkster Youth Living Center and the Golightly Vocational Technical Center in Detroit are getting extra academic help in the form of tutoring, thanks to a new program of Schoolcraft College.

Dubbed "Project Seed," the program dispatches college students to the Detroit locations to tutor children of all ages in any area in which they need help.

Doris Montgomery, the Golightly culinary arts department head, said of the tutors: "They're great, wonderful, a god-send."

And the kids? "The kids are much more interested in their classes," Montgomery said. "It's really been a big help."

Sylvia Dimaguila, the youth center's youth assistance coordinator, said 10-12 kids avail themselves of the Schoolcraft tutors Monday through Thursday. There has been "a lot of positive response from the parents," she said. And "grades have gone up."

Schoolcraft's Learning Assistance Center employs more than 30 tutors, who each spend two hours per week at Golightly or the youth center.

Half the tutors aim to gain the 100 "pre-teaching" hours required of prospective educators, said faculty facilitator Linda Talbert. The rest of them tutor for other reasons, some because it just feels good.

The program began in September 1993 as a four-year federal grant of \$100,000 kicked in. They started with Golightly, then spread to the Inkster youth center when tutors outnumbered available jobs, Talbert said.

Canton Township resident Debra Piper is one of 11 tutors from the Observer area. The 42-year-old mother of three boys is training to be an accounting clerk, so the tutoring experience is not a requirement for her degree.

She tutors because she enjoys it

and believes in volunteerism.

In fact, Piper has completed the tutoring requirement for college credit and now tutors for no benefit other than personal satisfaction.

It means something to Piper that she helps the disadvantaged children at the youth center get a leg up on life. "It makes them feel valued," she said.

The program calls for tutors to occupy a room at the youth center for two hours and help kids with whatever homework they're stumped by.

So the tutors never know what subject they'll be asked to cover. "Sometimes we don't know the answer to a problem and it's embarrassing," Piper said. But "the process of helping someone else learn something helps you learn it better, (too)."

Other local Schoolcraft College students who tutor include Kristi Hawn, Sarah Pile and Clayton Campbell, all from Canton Township. Also Matt Cooper and Trish Blevins of Livonia, Brad Erisman and Terri Hudson of Garden City, Jason Koch of Westland and Janet Breest and Dawn DeGraffenreid of Plymouth.

Now the Clinton administration has decided to spend its education dollars in a different way, and Schoolcraft's \$100,000 grant has been severed after \$35,000 was received. Learning center director Sirkka Gudan said this doesn't necessarily mean the program will wither and die, but may continue if money can be found in the budget.





Jamian targets mall smokers

Smoking will be restricted in mall commons areas under a House-passed bill on its way to the state Senate.

"We weren't sure when we introduced it, but we had 100 phone calls — 98 supporting and two against," said the sponsor, Rep. John Jamian, R-Bloomfield Township.

"Most support came from people who walk the malls and mothers with children. A problem was teenagers who hang out in malls and smoke. A mother told us of one teen who dropped a cigarette ash on her baby."

"Several malls in the state already are smoke-free," said Jamian, co-chair of the House Public Health Committee. "At first they were fearful of competition. Then they said it was one of the best things that ever happened. They've had more compliments."

If adopted, the bill would apply to mall commons areas — corridors, lounge sections, restrooms. Restaurants are covered by a separate law. Individual stores are not affected.

Jamian accepted an amendment allowing malls to establish separate smoking rooms with separate ventilation systems so that smoke will not be recycled into the mall.

The House Wednesday approved the bill 83-15. All area representatives voted yes except Greg Kaza, R-Rochester Hills, who voted no, and Penny Crissman, R-Rochester, who was absent for cancer treatments.

"This legislation infringes on free enterprise and restricts the private property rights of business persons and entrepreneurs," said Kaza in a formal protest. "It sends yet another market signal to entrepreneurs that Michigan is a hostile environment for business."

"As an asthmatic, I understand all too well the problem of second-hand smoke. But I question whether this bill is necessary. Five malls in Michigan have already banned smoking on their premises," Kaza said. "Mall owners and operators are aware of their customers' preferences."

Jamian disagreed. "They're like town squares. They're public places," he said pointing to their art exhibits and public programs.

Michigan malls attract 6.5 million adult visitors each month, according to a trade group. The federal Environmental Protection Agency said last year that 150,000 to 300,000 lower respiratory tract infections in children under 18 months are caused by passive, second-hand smoke.

Bills would limit settlements

Michigan may see few "Michael Jackson settlements" once a popular package of domestic violence bills becomes law, a key senator says.

Sen. William Van Regenmorter said a prosecutor "could permit criminal procedures to continue in spite of out-of-court (civil) settlement."

Jackson, once the nation's most popular rock star, was sued for sexually molesting a teenage boy but settled out-of-court for a sum estimated at many millions. As a

condition of settlement, however, the boy and his parents had to agree not to prosecute Jackson criminally.

"A magistrate may dismiss if the parties settle out of court," said Van Regenmorter, stressing "may."

The Republican from Jenison chairs the Senate Judiciary Committee, which produced three of the bills, which go to the House for hearings and passage. The other 11 bills already have been passed by the House but must be returned for concurrence in amendments.

Senators gave the bills votes of 36-0 and 35-0 without a protest. Sen. David Hongiman, R-West Bloomfield, was absent as he recuperates from an operation.

Junior League of Birmingham was credited with stimulating last year's package of House bills to punish domestic violence more severely and to make police and prosecutors treat complaints more seriously.

Among area sponsors: Rep. Barbara Dobb, R-Union Lake, sponsored a bill to allow courts to issue injunctions against threats of violence.

Dog sled racer readies for challenge

Sometime this week, after 1,049 miles of 40-degree-below-zero temperatures, swirling whetpits, frozen rivers, icy tundras, steep mountains and sleepless days and nights, Jack Berry Jr. and his team of Alaskan Huskies should arrive in Nome, Alaska.

But when you're talking about the Iditarod, the most famous of all sled dog races and the Alaskan equivalent of the Indianapolis 500, nothing is certain.

Most of what Jack Berry Sr. of Farmington knows right now about his son's hazardous 10-day journey across the wilds of Alaska are the tidbits he phoned to him daily from Anchorage by his two granddaughters, who get their information from the Alaskan media.

Berry Jr. was among the 58 mushers who started the race March 5 in Anchorage. As of Friday, he was 300 miles into the trip and taking a mandatory 24-hour layover.

In first Iditarod

It's Berry Jr.'s first Iditarod.

"He always was the type of kid who would have done well growing up in Daniel Boone's time," said Berry Sr., president of Pet Supplies Plus. "He likes wide open spaces and a more primitive life. And he's always had an interest in animals and dogs."

Feeding five tons of dog food yearly to more than 50 Alaskan Huskies is no inexpensive task. Berry Jr. got his big break in the mushing business a few years ago when Berry Sr. in 1988 launched his pet supply business on Telegraph Road in Redford Township.

His dad's new business ensured Berry Jr.'s sled dogs a steady stream of high-protein, high-fat dog food. Because they sponsor Berry Jr., some of the food is donated by Iams. The

rest also comes from Iams, but is paid for by Berry Sr. or by such other sponsors as Pfeister Co. and Stark and Co.

While now in his first Iditarod, Berry Jr. is no stranger to mushing across Alaska. In 1992, he raced in the 1,000-mile Yukon Quest Race. The race begins in Fairbanks and ends 15 days later in White Horse, Canada. Out of 47 mushers, he placed 13th, not a bad showing for a rookie.

Berry Jr.'s preparations for the 1994 Iditarod began last fall, when the warmer weather ended and he put away the tools of his cement mason's trade for the winter.

Since then, he's run his huskies daily, starting with 10-mile trips and building up to 80-mile trips.

"That's to build up his dogs' endurance as well as his own," Berry Sr. said.

The Iditarod tests the physical and mental endurance of both the musher and his sled dogs. At checkpoints, catering first to the comfort of his or her dogs, the musher often winds up with less rest than the dogs. That lack of sleep can lead to hallucinations on the trail.

What compels mushers to endure calamities from frostbite to zero visibility whiteouts is the same force that motivates all adventurers — to struggle against the elements and overcome them.

Berry Sr.'s company newsletter quotes Berry Jr. as saying: "Sometimes when you're in the middle of a race, and you're falling asleep on your sled in 40-degree-below-zero temperatures, you wonder why you're doing this. But after the race is over, and you and your dog team have prevailed over all of the elements, you know exactly why you're doing this. There's such a great feeling of satisfaction to finishing a race. I wouldn't trade it for anything."

Berry Jr. lives in Homer, about five hours from Anchorage. From his remote cabin, he runs his Lost Mountain Kennel. His sled dogs live outside in straw dog houses.

"They're bred and trained to survive outside," Berry Sr. said.

While Berry Sr. takes his son's adventures in stride, his mother, Jeannette, does most of the worrying for the family.

"She knows he's out there all by himself with 20 dogs that depend on him and in the most adverse weather conditions," Berry Sr. said. "She knows that a lot of things can go wrong, from a moose attack to getting off the track. She knows it's a dangerous thing to do. Luckily, so far, there's been no fatalities."

The roots of the Iditarod go back to 1925 when the residents of Nome suffered an epidemic and needed serum from Anchorage. Mushers and their sled dogs carried that life-saving serum to Nome. In 1973, the Iditarod began to commemorate that long-ago "race for life."

Before the race begins, mushers leave supplies at all the checkpoints, the furthest of which is 93 miles away.

"They leave more than they need in case of emergencies, such as getting snowed in," Berry Sr. said.

The top musher wins \$50,000, with smaller purses for the first 20 finishers. There's also a "Rookie of the Year" purse for the first-time Iditarod musher who excels.

"My son's objective is to place in the top 20, or win the rookie award," Berry Sr. said.

Sheriff's deputies: It's OK to feed fowl

Lured by food from folks who flock to visit them, the geese and duck population has surged on the west end of Newburgh Lake in Hines Park.

Birds that normally migrate as far south as Tennessee have chosen to make this section of the lake their year-round home.

But the glut of birds isn't causing any particular problems, say authorities.

A county sheriff's department corporal, who declined to be named, said sheriff's deputies' only concern is that geese and other birds slow up traffic when they waddle across Hines Drive in search of food.

And of people who stop, "We don't mind them feeding birds as long as they don't litter up the joint," he said.

The corporal gestured toward plastic bags strewn about the area, containers that once held bread or other feed left for the birds.

While he was observing the scene from a blue and gold sheriff's department patrol pickup truck, a woman and her two young children pulled alongside the road in their van, carrying loaves of bread to feed the birds.

When the sheriff's department corporal asks to talk to her, Sally Aninos of Plymouth says, "I know you weren't supposed to feed them in Livonia."

"You can feed them there," the corporal responds, adding that this section of Newburgh Lake is in Plymouth Township — and you can feed them here too.

He asks her not to leave the plastic wrappers holding the bread. "We always take them," she said.

Aninos said she and daughter Nicole, 6, and son Paul, 2, started feeding the birds last fall. "We usually feed them five days a week before she goes to school," Aninos said.

Even before unwrapping the bread, dozens of geese and ducks begin approaching them in anticipation of food.

"Once in a while, the kids get their fingers nipped," Aninos said. On this morning, the birds don't get that close, as they wait a few feet away before spearing pieces of bread tossed on the muddy ground.

"See the one with the broken wing? We always have to make sure we get him something because she's always worried about him," Aninos said.

Tim Payne, district wildlife biologist for the state Department of Natural Resources, said: "We're very strongly against feeding Canada geese or ducks for that matter."

"We discourage that because usually they're not getting a good diet."

Canada geese naturally graze on grass in the summer and eat corn and other grains in the winter — and wetland vegetation year-round. They're even known to eat apples, Payne said.

The DNR does relocate young birds when enough lakefront owners ask. But Payne said the county government has not asked the DNR to look into the rising geese and duck population in Hines Park.

Payne said geese and ducks have enough insulation to survive a severe cold snap like the one in January, adding they need open water and food.

He suggested that people who have in effect made pets out of the birds by feeding them in summer should continue to feed them in winter.







Markets stock up on exotic vegetables

Excuse me folks, but was I sleeping when someone secretly stocked my favorite grocery and produce store with an abundant assortment of vegetables with exotic names like rapini, enoki, and jicama?

Exotic choices

At Chimento's market in Livonia, I almost stumbled over gigantic portobello mushrooms bigger than a Frisbee.

I remember having to drive to LaColomona/Honey Bee Market in the heart of Detroit's Mexicantown for fresh chili peppers. Now Papa Joe's in Rochester stocks poblanos, jalapenos, habaneros, and other other varieties with enough firepower to light up the west side.

The jicamas were as abundant as coconuts at Nino Salvaggio's in West Bloomfield, while fresh raw horseradish was in great supply for Passover meals at the Shopping Center Market in Southfield.

I used to think that kiwi was exotic. Now, my produce market is a phone call away from ordering the gooseberries that my Uncle Earl would always request in a pie my sister Rose made with gooseberries gleaned from a northern farmer.

Either the popularity of iceberg lettuce is fading, or folks in Canton are on a Caesar salad kick. At Bob's Market in Canton, there were two feet of space for iceberg lettuce, and over six feet of space afforded romaine lettuce.

World markets

What's making all this possible? We might be on the information super highway, but overnight air transport and expanding world trade markets have opened the door to exotic mangoes from southeast Asia and mustard greens from India. Parsley root, originally from The Netherlands, is now grown exclusively in, get this folks, New Jersey!

Scientific researchers have found ways to keep a tomato shelf stable for almost 30 days. They've discovered a way to use the spores from morel mushrooms to be able to grow them year 'round in Mason, Mich.

Air express, world trade and scientific research certainly has helped expand our taste buds. The popularity of ethnic cuisines, a new appreciation of our own country's native regional products, and growing awareness of sound nutritional principles certainly must mean something to produce buyers nationwide, who are offering us more choices than ever before.

All of this is fine and dandy, and it certainly has expanded the taste horizons of the Janes Gang, but what about you?

Asking questions

When it comes to knowing the difference between arugula and zapotes, sooner or later the savvy shopper will have to begin asking questions.

Chances are nil that you might catch Julia Child on Good Morning America discoursing on tomatillos the day you need to buy a tomatillo.

Then again, if you think the kid at the store with an earring making \$4.15 an hour will be able to help you choose a ripe loquat, you've been sniffing too many prickly pears.

Ask for the produce manager when you see something that intrigues you. Consider it a free lesson in world trade, local geography and the fabled art of uncovering the uncommon vegetable.

A good source is Elizabeth Schneider's "Uncommon Fruits and Vegetables," (Harper & Row, copyright 1986). Your local library is another logical source, and the new computer card catalog makes researching fast and fun.

When you see something new at the market, check it out and give it a try. Just think of all those things your mother made you try that are an important part of your culinary regimen.

First timers might want to pick up a jicama, peel it and slice it into sticks as you would a carrot. Chill for about 30 minutes and taste what you've been missing.

I just couldn't believe my eyes when I checked momma's recipe box and found a recipe using nopales, also known as cactus pads. The recipe came from her snowbird friend Jean. They're available locally at Mexican markets and can be bought fresh or canned.

It's hard to believe the sumptuous dinner of baked Shannon salmon, steamed carrots, boiled potatoes, Irish minted peas and nutty blarney buns took Anna Gavin of Redford less than an hour to make. For a little holiday sparkle, she put mint-flavored ice cubes in glasses of apple juice for her

family to enjoy.

"The salmon is delicious, different and quick," said Anna. As the busy mother of three boys and a second-semester nursing student at Henry Ford Community College in Dearborn, she doesn't have time to fiddle around the kitchen.

Anna leaves fiddling to her husband, Mick, and son Mike, 17. Sean, 7, plays the bodhran, a goat skin Irish drum. Son Patrick, 15, is a gold medal gymnast and member of the boys competitive team at the Michigan Academy of Gymnastics in Westland.

Married for 18 years, Mick and Anna met at the Gaelic League Irish American Club in Detroit where she was giving tin whistle lessons.

Mick Gavin, the youngest of nine children who grew up in East Clare in southwest Ireland, comes from a family of musicians. He plays fiddle

and button accordion.

Anna was born in Detroit and plays piano, guitar and tin whistle. Her father, a history professor at the University of Detroit, was raised in Corktown. Anna, who earned a fine arts degree from the University of Detroit, remembers childhood visits to her grandmother in Corktown, learning about Irish literature from her father, and going to basement parties where Irish musicians played.

Mick came to the United States as a musician, and later fell back on floorcovering, the trade he learned in

Ireland, to support his family. Gavin, owner of Mick Gavin's Floorcoverings, spends his days taking care of business. In his spare time he plays the fiddle, passing his love of Irish music on to his sons.

"I enjoy it. It has made my life wonderful," said Mick, who performs with other musicians in the metro Detroit area.

Father and sons are busy rehearsing for an Irish festival of music, song and dance 4 p.m. to 2 a.m. Thursday, March 17, at the Bonnie Brook Country Club, 19950 Telegraph (be-

tween Seven Mile and Eight Mile) in Detroit. The price is \$6; children are free. There will be continuous entertainment, a cash bar, and corned beef and cabbage dinners will be sold. For more information, call 537-3489.

"It's a family event," said Gavin, explaining how the annual festival began nine years ago. "We had a lot of calls over the years from people who wanted to know what was going on culturally on St. Patrick's Day."

Featured performers include Ed McGlinchey, John Sands, Charlie Wilkie, the Kitty Heinzman Ceili Dancers and members of the U.S. and Canadian Champion City of Detroit Pipe Band.

Music is just one way the Gavins have given their sons a taste of Ireland. Anna has learned how to make many of the dishes her husband cherishes, including steak and kidney pie.

"When we first got married, he didn't think dinner was dinner without potatoes," said Anna.

"I miss home-baked bread and fresh sausage," said Mick. "We had beef once a week on Sunday. My mother raised chickens and turkeys. We had a small farm and ran a little grocery store."

Trout, salmon and herring are part of an Irish menu, along with beef and lamb stews, and ham with boiled cabbage. Root vegetables - potatoes, carrots, turnips, parsnips and beets - are meal staples.

If you want to serve a traditional dish on St. Patrick's Day, serve ham with cabbage. "Corned beef was cheaper than ham, that's why they used it when they came to this country," said Mick. "Beef is an export item in Ireland. It's expensive."

I can't remember if it was St. Patrick or Patrick the bartender at my favorite Irish pub who coined the phrase "Everyone's Irish on St. Patrick's Day."

Unfortunately, not being Irish, I was led to believe that corned beef, cabbage, potatoes, green beer and Irish whiskey were Irish culinary traditions. The sole Irish cooking tradition passed on to me in cooking school was the simple process of making soda bread and scones, certainly classified as "no brainers" because they require basic measuring, not much handling, and no yeast to worry about.

But who says you can't teach an old dog new tricks? The Irish possess a culinary heritage of hearty, homestyle comfort foods that we all have grown to love, cherish and enjoy.

Our story begins at the Irish Import Shop at 5472 Shafer in Dearborn. Owner Jack Derrig seems to have cornered the Irish market with his noted scones, fruitcakes, shortbread and "the only USDA-approved Irish sausage in the United States," says Derrig, host of his own Irish radio show on WMZK-Radio, 690 on the AM dial.

Visiting Derrig whetted my appetite for more Irish foodlore. I found myself totally immersed in Irish food and customs when Julie Demery and Pam and Jerry Maloney invited me to share an evening meal of fine Irish smoked salmon, brown soda bread, an Irish fondue and ice cream with an Irish whiskey sauce.

The Maloney's of Southfield and Demery of

Traditional fare for St. Pat's Day

CURRENT SCONES

2 cups white flour
2 teaspoons baking powder
2 teaspoons sugar
½ cup milk
½ teaspoon salt
4 tablespoons butter
1 egg, beaten well
½ cup currants
1 teaspoon fresh grated lemon rind

Preheat the oven to 450 degrees. Mix together the dry ingredients. Work in the butter with finger tips as in making a pie crust.

Add beate: egg, milk, currants and lemon peel. Mix well. Turn onto a floured board and knead 6 times. Pat out on a board until ¾ inch thick. Cut with a round cutter. Place scones on a lightly floured baking sheet and bake at 450 degrees for 15 minutes. Place scones

on a rack to cool.

Here is the recipe for one of the dishes featured at the upcoming Grand Irish Buffet at the Botsford Inn.

BEEF POT ROAST WITH GUINNESS STOUT

3-4 pounds English cut roast (chuck, rump, etc.)
¼ cup white flour
½ tablespoons garlic powder
½ tablespoons fresh ground black pepper
2 tablespoons solid vegetable shortening
1 large bay leaf
3 large onions, sliced
2-3 bottles Guinness Stout
6-8 smaller onions
6-8 carrots
6-8 medium potatoes, peeled
4-6 tablespoons butter
4-6 tablespoons white flour

Combine the ¼ cup white flour with the pepper and garlic powder on a large plate. Roll the English

cut roast through the mixture, flouring well on all sides. Melt the solid vegetable shortening in a large dutch oven and then brown the roast in the Dutch oven on all sides. Add the three large onions (sliced), two bottles of Guinness Stout and the bay leaf. Cover and cook for 3-4 hours at 350 degrees.

This is much longer than usual. You want the meat to be "overdone" and fall apart when served.

During the last hour of cooking, add the carrots, potatoes, small onions and another bottle of Guinness if the liquid in the Dutch oven is low. When the roast is cooked, remove the vegetables and cover to keep warm.

Pour 4 cups of boiling water over the roast to add to the juice. Remove the roast, cover and keep warm.

Using remaining 4-6 tablespoons of butter and flour, make a roux by combining both and stirring them into the simmering liquid to make a gravy. The recipe serves 6-8 easily. Leftovers make a great stew.

Here's a great topping for ice cream, bread pudding or other Irish desserts.


IRISH WHISKEY SAUCE

1 cup sugar
½ cup water
1 cup very strong coffee
1 ounce Irish Whiskey

Use a heavy saucepan. Dissolve the sugar in the water and stir and continue cooking until the sugar caramelizes and turns golden (about 15-25 minutes).

The mixture will get very hot. Use a long wooden spoon to stir mixture as plastic will melt and metal gets too hot. When the sugar caramelizes, remove it from the stove and stir in the very strong coffee.

Suggestion: Place the pot in the sink as the addition of the coffee will make the mixture bubble and possibly boil over. Stir in the coffee mixture and when it cools, stir in the Irish whiskey. Makes about 2 cups.

nearby West Bloomfield are officers in the Detroit Chapter of the Irish American Cultural Institute, and have started an Irish cooking school. The salmon dish Anna-Gavin made for our super supper feature was inspired by a dinner she and Mick shared in 1986 at the Old Ground Hotel in Ennis, County Clare. "We were there for a music festival," said Anna.

The dish is named Shannon salmon for the River Shannon where the famous salmon comes from.

BAKED SHANNON SALMON

6 salmon steaks
Spreadable margarine or softened butter
1 cucumber sliced thin
1 lemon sliced thin
Parsley for garnish

Spread salmon with butter on both sides. Wrap in tin foil. Bake at 400 degrees, (about 30 minutes). Garnish with cucumber and lemon slices and parsley. Salt and pepper to taste. Serves 6.

If desired, serve with a sauce

made from 1 cup of plain yogurt, 2 teaspoons fresh lemon juice, 1 tablespoon chopped fresh dill or 1 teaspoon dried.

Here's a variation of Anna's recipe from "365 Ways To Cook Fish and Shellfish," by Charles Pierce (HarperCollins Publishers, copyright 1993) that cooks in the microwave.

MICROWAVED SALMON STEAKS WITH CUCUMBERS AND MINT

1 medium cucumber, peeled, halved lengthwise, seeded and thinly sliced
1 tablespoon butter
¾ teaspoon salt
½ teaspoon pepper
4 salmon steaks, 1 inch thick (6-8 ounces each)
1 tablespoon chopped fresh mint or ¼ teaspoon dried

In a large microwave-safe cas-

serole, combine cucumber slices, butter, ¼ teaspoon salt, and ¼ teaspoon pepper. Cook on High, stirring once, until tender, about 3 minutes.

Remove from microwave, arrange fish on top, and season with remaining ¼ teaspoon salt and ¼ teaspoon pepper.

Cover dish with microwave-safe plastic wrap and fold back one corner to allow steam to escape. Cook on medium 7 minutes. Turn steaks over and cook until fish is opaque in center, 5 to 8 minutes longer. Sprinkle mint over salmon just before serving. Serves 4.

IRISH MINTED PEAS

1 bag frozen peas
1 teaspoon dried mint
1 teaspoon sugar (optional)
Butter or margarine

Add peas, mint and sugar to boiling salted water. Simmer until tender. Drain, toss with butter and serve.

Series offers '365 Ways' to enjoy food

One of the most popular cookbooks on kitchen shelves today — "365 Ways to Cook Chicken," by Cheryl Sedaker — started out as an editor's nightmare — a stack of recipes in no particular order.

"I took the job as a free-lance project," said Susan Wyler, who now edits the popular cookbook series. Wyler stopped by the Observer & Eccentric office recently to talk about the newest book in the series — "365 Easy Mexican Recipes," by Marge Poore, (HarperCollins Publishers, copyright, Jan. 26, 1994, \$17.95).

The "365 recipe" series started as a single cookbook when packager John Boswell presented the idea to HarperCollins publisher Bill Shinker. A book of 365 hamburger recipes published in 1972 had sold over a million copies. In 1984, Boswell decided to commission a book of chicken recipes because he believed chicken had become the "new hamburger."

With Wyler as editor, the series was born. When Boswell approached Wyler to copackager the cookbooks, she left her job at "Food & Wine" magazine, became

series editor, wrote her book "Country Farmhouse," and started a company, King Hill Productions, which packages cookbooks with Boswell.

During our interview, Wyler pointed out the "reader-friendly" virtues of the series — the books are made with a lie-flat binding; both the preparation time and cooking time are listed at the top of the recipe, the type is large enough to read from a cooking distance, the cover is washable, the steps are numbered, and you never have to turn a page to finish a recipe.

"These cookbooks are designed to be used in the kitchen," said Wyler. "Our new book '365 Easy Mexican Recipes' has authentic recipes and flavors with super-market ingredients."

Wyler is a careful editor who spends hours with the author going over every recipe with a "fine tooth comb," then it goes to a specially trained copy editor for another look-over.

Other titles in the series include — pasta, microwave recipes, one-dish meals, low-calorie meals, barbecuing and grilling recipes, Italian, hamburger, chocolate desserts, snacks, wok,

fish and shellfish, preparing for Christmas and cookies and brownies.

The series continues this spring with books containing "365" vegetarian, Chinese, cake and pie recipes.

"There's something communal about sitting around a table at meal time together," said Wyler who lived in Manhattan for nearly 20 years before moving to a country house in rural Pennsylvania. "I hope these books help people cook at home, and make it easy. The recipes won't take forever to make, and won't cost you an arm and a leg."

Here's a recipe from "365 Easy Mexican Recipes," to try.

CHICKEN TACO SALAD

2 tablespoons olive oil
1 pound skinless, boneless chicken breasts, cut into 1-inch pieces
1/2 teaspoon salt
2 tablespoons chili powder
1 medium head of iceberg lettuce, torn into bite-sized pieces
1 (8 ounce) can kidney beans, rinsed and drained

1 (4-ounce) can sliced black olives, drained
3 scallions, chopped
1 cup crushed tortilla chips
1 cup thick and chunky salsa
1 cup shredded Cheddar cheese (about 4 ounces)
1/2 cup sour cream
1 large tomato, chopped
1/4 cup chopped cilantro
In a medium skillet, heat oil over medium-high heat. Add chicken and cook, tossing, until white throughout but still juicy, 3 to 4 minutes. Add salt and chili powder. Cook, stirring, 1 minute to blend flavors. Remove from heat and set aside to cool slightly. (Chicken can be cooked ahead and refrigerated).

Divide Salad among 4 plates. Top each with a quarter of cheese, sour cream, chopped tomato and cilantro. Serves 4, prep time 15 minutes, cook 4 to 5 minutes.

SCRAMBLED EGGS WITH NOPALES

2 tablespoons pine nuts (pignolias)
2 tablespoons butter
1/4 pound nopales, de-picked and cut into pieces
2 tablespoons green chili peppers, diced
7 eggs
Salt and pepper to taste
Toast the pine nuts over low heat in a skillet until lightly browned, stirring often. Set aside.
Melt the butter in a heavy frypan and stir in the nopales and cook over medium heat until tender, about 4-5 minutes. Stir in chili peppers and eggs. Scramble eggs until desired doneness is reached. Season with salt and pepper to taste. Sprinkle with pine nuts and serve. Serves 3.

SAUTED FENNEL WITH LEMON

2 medium fennel bulbs, about 1 1/2 pounds
2 tablespoons olive oil
1/4 teaspoon salt, or to taste, optional
1 teaspoon fresh grated lemon peel
Pepper to taste
Trim and reserve the fennel leaves and cut off any top stalks and reserve. Quarter each bulb lengthwise; then cut each quarter crosswise in very thin slices.
Mince one tablespoon of the leaves. Heat oil in a large, heavy skillet; toss fennel slices to coat. Add salt and continue tossing over moderate heat until tender, about 8-10 minutes.
Toss with lemon juice and sprinkle with pepper to taste. Sprinkle with minced caps. Serves 3.

1/2 cup toasted wheat germ
1/4 cup margarine or butter, softened
2/3 cup packed brown sugar

In a medium mixing bowl combine 2 cups of the all-purpose flour and the yeast; set aside. In a medium saucepan heat milk, honey, 1/4 cup margarine or butter, and salt until warm (120 degrees F to 130 degrees F) and margarine is melted. Add milk mixture to flour mixture;

add egg. Beat with an electric mixer on low speed for 30 seconds, scraping bowl constantly. Beat on high for 3 minutes. Using a wooden spoon, stir in wheat and rye flours, wheat germ and as much remaining all-purpose flour as you can.

Turn dough out onto a lightly floured surface. Knead in enough all-purpose flour to make a moderately stiff dough (6 to 8 minutes). Place in a greased bowl; turn once. Cover and let rise in a warm place until nearly double (1 1/4 hours).

Punch dough down. Turn dough out onto a lightly floured surface; divide in half. Cover; let rest for 10

minutes. Roll each half to a 15-inch square. Spread with softened margarine; sprinkle with brown sugar. Roll up jelly-roll style; cut into thirds. Seal ends; place in six greased 5 1/2- by 3- by 2-inch pans. Cover; let rise in a warm place until double (about 45 minutes). Bake in a 350-degree F oven about 30 minutes or until loaves sound hollow when tapped. Remove from pans. Cool on wire racks. Makes 6 small loaves (48 servings total).

MUSIC NOTES

When people in the United States see Eve's Plum name for the first time, chances are they recognize it as resembling the name of the woman who played Jan Brady on the Brady Bunch. Abroad, few make the connection, although they have their own interpretation. That's fine to guitarist Michael Kotch. "That's cool because then they realize that we're not some band with a totally obscure name."

Eve's Plum was in town to play the Blind Pig in Ann Arbor March 11 with a band with an equally intriguing name, Tripping Daisy.

Usually record companies have to beg radio stations to play singles by new acts. With Cry of Love, their label had to tell them not to play their song "Peace Pipe" until the band was ready. "Radio jumped on it," lead singer Kelly Holland said.

"They embraced it right away. We had to tell them 'Don't play it just yet.'" Cry of Love and their label wanted to make sure that their marketing and touring strategies were set first. Since releasing "Peace Pipe," Cry of Love has been repeatedly told of their uncanny resemblance to early 1980s bands. Holland isn't insulted the least bit. After all, "rock 'n' roll is an apple that doesn't fall very far from the tree." Bands copy each other and add a personalized tinge to it, he added.

Cry of Love played Harpo's on Friday, March 11.

Blind Melon proved at their Wednesday, March 9, show at the State Theatre in Detroit that they are more than a one-hit wonder. Blind Melon, performing their best Detroit show to date, was able to keep up the energy of the near-capacity crowd longer than the length of their acoustic hit "No Rain." The band sounded fuller and seemed more confident on stage — especially lead singer Shannon Hoon who frequently joked around with fans. (Although most of what the soft-spoken Hoon said was inaudible.) During previous stops to the area with acts such as Neil Young, Guns 'N' Roses and Public Image, Ltd., the band and its music tended to get lost in the venues. This time around Blind Melon's music sounded fuller while Hoon's vocals and Christopher Thorn's acoustic guitar came across clearly. The 1 1/2-hour show also included a near-perfect rendition of "Tones of Home."

Reading through the lyrics of Carter the Unstoppable Sex Machine's latest album "Post-Historic Monsters," you'd think that they were telepathic. In the song "Commercial Suicide Part 1" the band writes "Throw your Gameboys in the fire. Bono (of U2) ain't the new messiah. Michael Jackson is a liar." "With that line, it was written before we knew anything about his supposed activities," vocalist Jim Bob said about the song. He thought to use the word only because it "rhymed with desire."

When Carter USM comes to St. Andrew's Hall at 8 p.m. Sunday, March 27, fans will notice an additional member — a drummer. Previously the band used recorded drum tracks during its live show, something that went over well in the United Kingdom but caused controversy here. "Everyone accepts it," he said of UK fans. "In the States, musicians and fans didn't like it. They felt we were cheating and somehow wrong. . . . Now I can't see how we never had one." The New York band Lotion opens the show. Call (313) 961-MELT for more information.

Unsigned bands are eligible to win a gig in Japan through the 1994 "Soundcheck — The Yamaha Music Showcase," which begins in the summer. Bands in any genre that play originals and are not signed to a nationally distributed record label are eligible to enter.

Last year, East Lansing's The Verve Pipe won the national contest and played at MusicQuest, an international pop and rock showcase in Japan. To receive an entry form, call Soundcheck at (800) 451-7625. The deadline is May 31.

Grant Lee Buffalo is a band that is definitely benefitting from a general admission seating policy. The band will open for Pearl Jam at the Masonic Temple in Detroit on Saturday, March 19, and at Crisler Arena in Ann Arbor on Sunday, March 20. Fans are expected to rush in to the venues to secure good seats shortly after the doors open — plenty of time before Grant Lee Buffalo hits the stage.

Grant Lee Phillips, the jangly alternative rock band's guitarist and vocalist, never thought about it like that.

What to watch for in Street Scene next week:

Fishbone — It's in the 'Swim'

■ Last year was an eventful year for Fishbone — some of it good, some of it bad. But it's been the release of their album "Give a Monkey a Brain and He'll Swear He's the Center of the Universe" that has broadening their ska-based following.

The flurry of activity is overwhelming Angelo Christopher Moore, lead vocalist/saxophonist for Fishbone.

Answering the phone in his Richmond, Va., hotel room, Moore doesn't sound quite together.

"I got chicken in my hand; the phone's tangling up . . . all kinds of confusing (stuff)." He drops the phone and momentarily gets his act together.

He picks up the phone and begins chatting about the last year. For Fishbone, it has been an endless stream of events — good and bad.

They released the album "Give a Monkey a Brain and He'll Swear He's the Center of the Universe" to critical acclaim. The syndicated

rock radio station Z-Rock picked up on the single "Swim," broadening their primarily ska-based following.

During the summer they co-headlined the Lollapalooza Festival and afterward gigged around Europe with Stone Temple Pilots and the Mighty Mighty Bosstones.

Behind the scenes Fishbone bassist Norwood Fisher faced charges for allegedly kidnapping the band's former guitarist Kendall Rey Jones from a religious group. Fisher was later acquitted.

That incident, Moore said, is now filed away as part of the band's ongoing transformation process. With Jones' heavy metal influences in tow, the California band has slowly folded hard rock in with its ska sound.

"It's been a big progression; it's been a transformation. We've transformed into something," he said. "We just play different kinds of music. On each album, there's a different focus on different kinds of music."

John Bigham eventually replaced

Jones and Fishbone collectively proved — musically and theatrically — during Lollapalooza that they were one of the most dynamic bands around. During their opening song, "Swim," Fishbone dropped their curtain, adorned with their trademark fish, while repeatedly shouting "The pool is open." A cartoon-like mechanical fish flapped its jaws and flew above the band.

Upon hearing that "Swim" was one of the highlights of Lollapalooza, Moore's spirits are lifted.

"Yeah? Cool. This time we won't have the (mechanical) fish but we're still gonna have 'The pool is open,'"

he said like an anxious child trying to earn approval.

Their tour, which comes to St. Andrew's Hall in Detroit on Saturday, March 19, will primarily feature material from "Give a Monkey . . ." — unless bassist Fisher is convinced otherwise.

"They might get a pinch of the old set, so if you have any requests you're going to have to ask Norwood. He takes care of all that. It's hard for me to get in a request and I'm in the band."


After the tour, the band is taking a well-deserved break. There is preliminary talk about Fishbone's next

album, but it's "up in the air." According to Moore, their label, Columbia, wants them to do a greatest hits package featuring remixes of older songs and a few covers.

"We want to do all originals. . . . They can't lose what Fishbone has to offer them."

Steve Gornall gives Motor City the blues

Guitarist/vocalist Steve Gornall and his high-energy Blue Collar Blues Band have been local fixtures for years. From Sisko's to Mr. Lou's to Sully's, where they supplied my first taste of live music for the year, patrons have been lined up and geared up for Gornall's revved up take on the rockin' blues.

None of the acclaim that's come his way, most especially since the release of the extraordinary "Steve Gornall & The Blue Collar Blues Band" disc on the local Blues Factory label, has gone to his head. Like most overnight sensations, he's been at this for awhile.

In the early 1970s, his band Nature, which was the pride of Livonia and opened for local luminaries like Bob Seger and Ted Nugent, gave him his first taste of fame. He traces his enthusiasm and involvement, however, back to the seventh grade, when he and Robert Noll, another of the main

players in the local blues community, started jamming.

Noll went to Chicago and worked with legends like Albert Collins and Big Twist. Gornall spent a decade in the trenches of the Hollywood cut-throat Top 40 and rock world of the 1970s-80s, where he worked with "whoever would pay" him. Among those were Paul Warren, former Doors keyboardist Ray Manzarek and Richard Marx, with whom he appeared on that bastion of pop music, "American Bandstand." By the time he got back home, he was ready to dive head-first into the honesty of blues music.

The Blue Collar Blues Band, anchored by drummer Vinnie Scalabrino and bassist Tim Garrick, and featuring the secret weapon of harmonica playing icon Kenny Welk, is a band that burns in a big way, and frontman Gornall is as a tight bundle of music energy.

Wearing a wide variety of influences on his sleeve, from Duane Allman

to Stevie Ray Vaughan to Buddy Guy, Freddie King and Eddy Clearwater, he's a wholly unique player in his own right. A writer of classical proportions, he's absorbed the past 30 years of rock and blues guitar heritage, distilled it and alluded to it all over the new disc.

"All You Gotta Do," for instance, has an opening right out of Jimi Hendrix's "Belly Button Window," while "Daddy's Little Girl" takes the Chuck Berry highway and "Red Hot" works a CCR "Born on the Bayou" groove into the introduction. On "7-11 Sunset Strip," the band works in a style that would do Little Charlie and the Nightcats proud, and "Heart on the Ground" comes straight out of an Otis Rush bag. But cuts like "Runnin'" and the incendiary instrumental that is "Busy Guitar" more than adequately demonstrate, Gornall is a wholly unique picker. It's a style that's turned many a sleepy

club into an SRO hot spot for years.

Unfortunately, he has been growing weary of the local scene. By the time you read this, Gornall, one of the baddest guitar players Detroit has ever called their own, is West Coast-bound once again. While he's quick to praise Blues Factory for all they've done for him, he does not want his reputation to begin and end in a handful of clubs in the Detroit area, and on a small label that only has so many resources available for promotion.

His plan is to look up old connections and acquaintances, like John Mayall and guitarist Coco Montoya, and see about getting signed with a big label with a big budget — at least big enough to support a national tour, either in clubs or as an opening act in the arenas.

With Gornall in California, the Detroit blues scene certainly is feeling the loss of a vibrant link.

The remaining members of the Blue Collar Blues Band have hardly slipped under the back porch, though. They will continue to perform.

"That's true. I've gotten to shows just as the opening band is bowing and saying, 'Thank you.' I'm sure that they will bail as soon as we leave," the affable Phillips said. "But then again I'm not always grounded in reality."

The band took a break from recording its follow-up to "Fuzzy" when it became clear that they were going to do a few Midwestern dates with Pearl Jam. Both area shows are sold out.

With the release of the album "Modern Life is Rubbish," Blur is hoping that their fans will be able to see their musical focus a little clearer. The English pop band feels the public got the wrong idea about them after they released their 1991 album "Leisure" and the single "There's No Other Way." It's "something with not a great deal of depth," the dishev-

eled lead singer Damon said matter of factly during a press conference at Chicago's Cabaret Metro club. "Modern Life is Rubbish" is lyrically more mature and musically sound. The opening track "For Tomorrow" features the Duke String Quartet under Blur's lush Beatlesque harmonies. The band also retreated to the vocal style in the shamelessly addictive "Sunday Sunday" and "Chemical World."

It doesn't take long to figure out the band's opinion of modern rock. (Start with the title "Modern Life is Rubbish" and the harmonies.) "We made a conscious decision to remove ourselves from all possible comparisons. Here we are now, in our own pigeonhole."

'Gilbert' searches for an audience

You can't accuse Johnny Depp of wimping out on film roles. The pretty boy actor whose name sounds like it was developed by a Hollywood agent has starred in John Waters' "Cry Baby" and Tim Burton's "Edward Scissorhands," among others.

Add to the list "What's Eating Gilbert Grape," an offbeat and often moving new film which will hopefully stick around long enough to find an audience.

Depp's Gilbert is a teenager with way too much responsibility. He works at the local grocery not so much for the job opportunity but because he can lug home several bags of groceries each night to feed his 500-pound mother (Darlene Cates).

She can't cook or even move from the couch to eat, so Gilbert and his two sisters literally bring the dinner table to her. While he loves his mother, Gilbert shares the town's fascination with her freakishness and even hoists

neighborhood kids up the window to get a gander.

On top of this, Gilbert is saddled with Arnie (Leonardo DiCaprio), his almost 18-year-old, mentally handicapped brother. The boy has a bad habit of climbing the local water tower until Gilbert, usually surrounded by a gathering crowd of townspeople, can talk him down.

Depp, sporting long hair and an almost visible weight on his shoulders, looks at home in the dilapidated farmhouse in Endora, Iowa. He gains a new perspective from a worldly and beguiling young woman, played by Juliette Lewis, who stops in Endora while her grandmother's travel trailer is stalled for repairs on the outskirts of town.

Lewis, the young actress so memorable in Scorsese's "Cape Fear" and Woody Allen's "Husbands and Wives," gives the role

a mystical quality. She inspires Gilbert to live a bit for himself and not just for others.

Stealing scenes from Lewis and a whale-sized actress is no easy task, but Leonardo DiCaprio is so uninhibited and all over the place that you can't take your eyes off of him. He has copped an Oscar nomination for best supporting actor and, if there's any justice at all in Hollywood, he'll win.

"Gilbert Grape" is the latest from Swedish director Lasse Hallstrom, whose bizarrely titled "My Life as a Dog" was an equally unusual account of childhood that developed a minor cult following. Halstrom turns America's heartland into a place that is both bracingly realistic and also decidedly surreal.

Endora, according to the film, is a small town on the brink of commercialization. The locally owned grocery where Gilbert works is constantly threatened by the monster supermarket across the street, where assistant managers bustle through the aisles and a tank full of live lobsters attracts

customers to the meat department.

Gilbert's best friend, a local lawncare guy, dreams of owning a Burger Barn, which he considers "on the cutting edge of the fast food industry" because it uses Canola oil for the fries. His other buddy, a mortician's son played by the ever-quirky Crispin Glover, drops less-than-subtle hints about elderly relatives in the hopes of bolstering a sagging family business.

Although it wanders sometimes aimlessly, "Gilbert Grape" is a slice-of-life movie that will probably stick with you a little longer than most. It has an engaging sense of humanity that is at once tragic, life affirming and unforgettable.

Greens are keen for spring scenes

Think St. Patrick's Day, think the Trinity, think the shamrock leaf. Though it may seem oddly circumspect, when I think of St. Patrick's Day, I think primarily of color — green beer, green leprechauns, green clover and ultimately, green attire.

As a retail writer, I attach new meaning to every holiday. Easter inspires bonnets, Valentine's Day conjures rose-strewn gifts and, alas, St. Patrick's Day affords the opportunity to preview spring fashions in shades of green.

Luckily, green is in for spring. And amazingly, those who attach names to colors in the fashion industry have outdone themselves with the usually generic green. Forget hunter or emerald or olive. The new greens are as vivid as spruce or lime or apple, as soft as leaf or willow or meadow, and as pungent as basil or pine, sage or spearmint.

Greens of spring

Imagine a linen jacket the color of seaweed, a pear-hued straw hat or a silk jacquard vest in jade. A day of window-shopping will reveal all of these greens and more.

boutiques to uncover the newest green garb. At Maggie & Me, 924 W. Ann Arbor Trail in Plymouth, the original designs are always fun and imaginative. The outfit pictured pairs a willow green floral vest (\$88) with moss-colored shorts (\$52). The black T is trimmed and tied at the shoulder with a contrasting floral print (\$38). Pockets combine

vintage fabrics for a contemporary look that bespeaks a bygone era.

"All of the clothes here are whimsical, creative, feminine," said a woman named Katie from Ann Arbor. "They inspire you to go back to your wardrobe and use bits of things to create new things, an environment." Mary Matalin talks politics in Hudson's fashion show series



When Hudson's announced that Mary Matalin would be spring's guest speaker for its Challenging the Future series, the phones began ringing and the event sold out in two days. Matalin's presentation didn't disappoint the crowd.

Mary Matalin is a lot of things, and that's why Detroit-area women drove to Hudson's Oakland Mall store March 5 to hear her speak at an 8 a.m. breakfast event.

Matalin didn't disappoint them.

Her material came from the 1992 presidential campaign where, as George Bush's deputy campaign manager, she emerged as a vocal and controversial defender of the president and his policies.

It came from experiences on her new weeknight talk show, "Equal Time," where, with co-host Jane Wallace, newsmakers of the day air insider views. And it came from her three-month-old marriage to Bill Clinton's campaign manager, James Carvell.

"I love this guy," she said defending her marriage to the opposition. "I'm crazy for this big-taxing, big-spending, redistributionist demagogue."

The good-natured putdowns continued when she was asked about the Bushes. "I had lunch with President Bush recently. And he looks fit and tan. He still refers to Clinton as 'What's His Name.' I really like the Bushes. They are good citizens... true public servants."

"Despite the rigors of politics, they managed to raise five kids who turned

out great. They are not of this era, however. Bush wasn't a good speechmaker. He didn't understand TV."

"He told me that Barbara was ready to publish a book on her memoirs. Barb's making all this money now, he joked. 'And she's waving this independence in my face.'"

But the meat of her message was to warn the audience of the dangers of emerging "Junk Journalism," which Matalin blamed for the "firing" of George Bush.

"The lines between hard news journalism and tabloid journalism are blurred," she said. "Reporters in the print media are trying to compete with the electronic media, and they can't get the news out as fast as television or radio can. So they are turning to news analysis and opinion reporting to sell their papers."

Running with the pack

Matalin said a "pack mentality" exists in newsrooms where the same viewpoints are reinforced in papers across the country by editors because, "How can we run a story about Bush that's positive, when it's running on the wire services that Bush is having a bad day?"

She cautioned that when stories about various national health plans are published, they are often about

who's for what plan, instead of the contents of the plans or their ramifications.

"You think you are getting news," Matalin said. "But what you are getting is horse race and poll stories."

Who's on what side? Who's winning?"

She insisted her views weren't sour grapes and quoted from an article by

political journalism guru David Broder, who also warns about the "trivialism of substance by today's media."

Matalin said the country's best minds are forced to communicate complex issues to the public in 9-second sound bites that can make the 4 p.m. evening news deadlines.

"This has led to the media giving a very cynical public a very distorted picture of our society," she said. "Yet in order to preserve democracy, we need participation by citizens who are informed and interested."

Matalin rocked the crowd by revealing that reports of Clinton's \$200 haircut that allegedly stopped air traffic for two hours were untrue. "The incident never happened," she said.

And she insisted that an incident where an editor claimed Bush was so out of touch with the masses that he didn't know what a grocery scanner was also never happened.

Check it out

"So I leave you with this advice," Matalin said. "The next time you want to boot out a school board member or remove a state representative because of a reported incident, call up their office and find out if what you read or heard really happened."

Her views were appreciated by sisters Ruth Rosetti of Shelby Township and Connie Cowper of Clarkston.

"I think she's so intelligent and refreshing," Rosetti said. "I like her show on CNBC. She's wonderful. I just wish she would have told us how to get the truth if we can't depend on the media."

"But she did," Cowper said. "She gave you something to think about while you're reading or listening to the news."

Judy Elliot of Farmington Hills came to hear Matalin with some friends from the Ford Motor Co. in Dearborn.

"I appreciated her perspective on how information is given and

received today," she said. "She certainly gave us all something to think about."

Practical programs

Hudson spokeswoman Chris Morrisroe said that's what Hudson's semi-annual Challenging the Future series was all about. Of course, the department store wants to show its seasonal merchandise to the audience most likely to buy it, but it also wants to give customers interesting programs that affect lifestyles.

"Matalin was brought in through the Washington Speaker's Bureau, and she will eventually address all three of our markets — Detroit, Chicago and Minneapolis," Morrisroe said.

Morrisroe said shoppers have asked Hudson's to bring in Oprah

After Matalin spoke, a 134-outfit spring fashion show hit the runway, including a large-size model for the first time. Morrisroe said customers want to see real people wearing real clothes and Hudson's is glad to oblige, "because that's what we're all about," she said.

After the show, (and a boxed breakfast that included a pastry basket filled with fresh berries, a tart with imported cheeses, and a cinnamon scone with flavored butters), guests made their way through Hudson's with coupons for discounts and cosmetic makeovers.

Hudson's also used the occasion to debut the new espresso bar on the second floor, Caffè Giò. This new European-style deli and coffeehouse features drinks and light menus-to-go as well as cappuccino, espresso drinks, Italian sodas and desserts. There is counter seating for five. The Internet

A worldwide web linking more than 14,000 computer networks, from giant mainframes to desktop PCs. Designed originally for research and technical uses, it's not very user-friendly. But that's changing as more casual users hop on board. Hook up through:

• WORK OR SCHOOL.

If your company computer network has access to the Internet, ask to share in the connection. College students often can get a free account through school.

• COMMERCIAL ON-LINE! SERVICES OR BULLETIN BOARDS.

Some offer only electronic mail connections. Others, like Delphi and the WELL, offer full Internet connections.

• INTERNET ACCESS PROVIDERS.

A number of companies allow you to connect up for a fee, from a few dollars an hour to \$50 a month or more. Several books, including *The Internet Companion* and *Connecting to the Internet* list these companies. Or call InterNIC, an Internet information service, at 800-444-4345, for a list of providers.

THE MAIN TOOLS FOR NAVIGATING THE NET.

• ELECTRONIC MAIL (E-MAIL):

Electronic messages transmitted usually in a matter of seconds - from one user to another via the Internet.

• FILE TRANSFER PROTOCOL (FTP):

Allows you to copy a file from another computer to your own. Good for acquiring games, pictures, computer programs or documents.

• TELNET:

A means of tapping into a remote computer to gain access to its publicly available files as if you were directly connected. Particularly useful for perusing library card catalogs or large databases.

• ARCHIE, GROPER, WAIS, WWW, VERONICA: Popular search tools for sifting through the vast amount of information on the Internet.

WHAT'S ON THE INTERNET?

Government documents, library catalogs, databases, computer software, games, bulletin boards, discussion groups and an electronic mail system that offers virtually instantaneous worldwide communication.

There's not a directory of everything available on the Internet. There's just too much. But here's a sampling:







Goins propels Rockets to title

■ Westland John Glenn captured the Class A district boys basketball championship Friday night at Romulus with a 59-57 win over Wayne.

Haven't we gone through this before? The Westland John Glenn football team made a sterling run in the state playoffs last fall, and now the basketball team is starting to make the same kind of noises.

Riding the scintillating 32-point performance of 6-foot-4 senior forward Tony Goins, the Rockets are off to the regionals after beating rival Wayne Memorial for the second time this season, 59-57, Friday at Romulus.

The district champion Rockets, now 18-4 overall, will play Adrian in the Class A regional semifinals, 7 p.m. Thursday at Jackson High School.

"Coming into this program last year I wanted us to earn the respect of being a smart, disciplined basketball team instead of a shake and bake type of ballclub," said Glenn second-year coach Mike Schuette, who went with his five starters the entire way. "I thought tonight we played under control. There weren't too many times where we went one-on-one."

The Rockets shot 50 percent from the field and committed just 12 turnovers.

Goins hit 12 of 17 shots from the floor, including a pair of three-pointers. He also made six of seven free throws and grabbed 12 rebounds. Teammate Guy Rucker, a 6-9 junior center, added 15 points, 10 rebounds and seven blocked shots.

"Goins and Rucker are just really tough," said Wayne coach Chuck Henry, who congratulated the victorious Rockets in their locker room afterwards. "We had a difficult time matching up with either or both of them."

"Tony was the best tonight. He's strong off the dribble and strong off the offensive and defensive boards. He did it all."

It was a dogfight from start to finish.

Wayne led 12-11 after one quarter, but Glenn took a 29-26 lead at intermission.

In the third quarter, Glenn's Savon Hubbard scored a hoop with 1:55 left to give his team a 41-34 advantage.

But Wayne responded with seven unanswered points, capped by Gerald Adams' bucket with three seconds to go, knotting the count at 41-all.

Wayne twice led by a point, 52-51 and 54-53, with 2:38 and 1:45 remaining in the fourth. But Rucker's short turn-around with 1:22 put Glenn ahead to stay. Albert Jones' drive down the middle gave the Rockets a three-point cushion, 57-54, with 45 seconds left.

A pair of free throws by Goins then made it 59-54, but Wayne's Jameel Wooden drilled a three-pointer with 14 seconds left, pulling the Zebras to

within two.

Wayne fouled Hubbard on the ensuing inbound pass. The Glenn guard missed the front end of a one-and-one.

Wooden came down and fired up a long three-pointer that missed the mark. Courtney Howard grabbed the rebound and tried to hit the rim, but the ball was partially blocked.

Goins, fittingly, grabbed the rebound as time expired.

"I've always been the kind of coach who is the first to congratulate the other team and other players," Schuette said. "But on this night I have to say that Tony Goins is as good as anybody I've seen on this side of the state."

Wayne, which bowed out at 16-6 overall, got 13 points from Howard, a 5-11 senior guard. Wooden, a sophomore, and Adams, a senior, each added 10.

The Zebras hit 22 of 55 shots from the floor (40 percent) and committed only 11 turnovers.

"We hit some big shots, we just needed one more," Henry said. "All I remember is two teams fighting hard and trying to advance in the tournament."

With the rapidly improving Rucker becoming more and more of a force each time out, Glenn appears to have an excellent shot at winning the regional, which also includes Ann Arbor Pioneer and Taylor Center.

"Our perimeter people are realizing they can have a great game, and yet get the ball to our big people," Schuette said.

But even Rucker's solid outing paled in comparison to his teammate Goins.

"Tony played a real good game, he stepped up when most of us couldn't get into a rhythm offensively," the junior center said.

Brusseau, who played for a Midget AAA travel team last year, joined his teammates in a victory lap around the ice afterward.



When Joe Daly watches University of Michigan basketball games the next few years, he'll remember Friday night.

Daly, Redford Catholic Cen-

tral's senior center, helped contain UM-bound Maurice Taylor as the Shamrocks survived a fourth-quarter scare and beat Detroit Henry Ford, 62-45, for the Class A district title at Southfield.

CC (16-5) will play state-ranked Detroit Cooley Tuesday at Southfield. Tip-off is 7:30 p.m.

"When I see (Taylor) playing for U-M, I'll remember covering him tonight," Daly said, adding that Taylor will have little problem blending in with the sometimes vocal Wolverines.

"He did a lot of talking," Daly said. "He was saying things like 'I'm an all-American and I'm going to show you why.'"


Daly, with the help of Sean Gallagher off the bench, limited Taylor to 19 points on an 8-for-26 shooting performance. The 6-foot-8" center added eight rebounds and seven blocks. Daly (11 points) and Gallagher (10) outscored Taylor and matched him in rebounds.

"Our plan was to go right at him and not alter your shot," said guard Andy Slankster, who scored a game-high 23 points — one short of matching his career-best. "We didn't do anything special on him," Daly said. "We just wanted to help out on defense and contain him."

Taylor played the entire game in foul trouble and was forced to exit the game with 45 seconds left after crashing to the floor on a layup attempt. It was the third time Taylor needed assistance after a fall on the court. Taylor sustained an injury to his left shoulder, but the injury isn't serious.

CC coach Bernie Holowicki, who scouted Ford six times this year, said the Shamrocks' game plan for Taylor was simple.

"We just wanted to play him hard and lean on him," Holowicki said. "He's an awesome talent."

We were worried when Joe picked up his third foul in the second quarter but Sean came in and did a good job."

The Shamrocks led 44-33 entering the fourth quarter, but the Trojans scored the next seven points to cut the lead to 44-40. CC regrouped after a timeout and outscored Ford 18-5 to end the game.

CC converted eight-of-11 free throws in the final three minutes and forced the Trojans to miss 12 of 15 shot attempts. For the game, Ford shot only 29 percent (18-62), compared to CC's 38 percent (21-56).

Daly played all but one minute of the second half with four fouls and Andy Kummer fouled out 31 seconds into the fourth quarter. Still, the Shamrocks survived with good bench play from Gallagher and sophomore guard Justin Hoener.

CC led 11-6 after the first quarter, as Ford committed seven

turnovers and missed several easy shots. CC would have led by more if Taylor didn't swat away five shots.

CC led 26-14 at halftime but a different Ford team came out for the third quarter as the Trojans attacked inside. Taylor had 10 points in the quarter but CC maintained an 11-point lead heading into the final quarter.

"I saw them play twice this year and I don't think we underestimated them," Ford coach William Carter said. "You don't win the Catholic League if you're not a good team. I think they were tougher than I thought. We matched up well, but just made too many mistakes early in the game."

"If we didn't miss so many easy shots, didn't commit so many turnovers and converted some of our free throws early in the game, perhaps it would have been different. You can't fall that far behind to a team like CC and expect to win."

Salem crowned Churchill goes flat in 2nd half

What Plymouth Salem needed at halftime was some sort of energy transfusion. Something to get their collective engines jump-started. Rocks' coach Bob Brodie had spent much of the first half searching for that missing ingredient, but had come up empty.

This was no meaningless game. A Class A district basketball championship was at stake.

Livonia Churchill, winner of just seven of its previous 21 games, had a 23-21 lead over 18-3 Salem at the break. "We were trying to penetrate," said Charger coach Tom Lang. "When we penetrated, good things happened."


But a couple of things changed in the second half. Salem turned up its defense a few notches, Churchill started to fade, and a game that was close for 2½ quarters ended in a rout — with Salem on top, 60-38, at Northville.

The win takes the Rocks to the Highland Park regional against an old nemesis: Detroit Pershing and Willie Mitchell, a lethal combination that ended Salem's season last year with an 83-52 pounding in the regional final. The game is 6 p.m. Tuesday.

"We're looking forward to it," said Brodie. "These guys want the opportunity to show they're a better team than they showed last year."

If Salem plays any part of Tuesday's game like it did in the first half against Churchill, Pershing will enjoy another lopsided victory. "My kids did exactly what I wanted them to do," said Lang of Churchill's first-half effort.

Brodie agreed. "It was hard for us coming off that emotional win (over Plymouth Canton in the semis)," he said, "and

Churchill executed their game plan to perfection. They spread us out (defensively) and went inside."

Which is where Bill Morris did his damage. The junior forward muscled his way into the paint to knock down 10 first-half points.

But the Rocks adjusted, and the second half belonged to them. They recaptured the lead at the 4:17 mark of the third quarter on a basket by James McDonald; Churchill never regained it.

Indeed, the Chargers could not score at all. They managed just six points in the third quarter on 3-of-10 shooting, and were worse in the fourth period — Salem scored 17-straight points before Churchill countered with two free throws by Jeff Anderson with 3:53 left.

By then it was far too late. Salem had already finished the third quarter with an 11-2 run to take a 36-29 lead into the final period; the Rocks' 17-point run provided them with a 53-29 advantage. The Chargers didn't score a basket until less than a minute remained. In the second half, they were 5-of-20 from the field (25 percent).

"We switched to a half-court trap and increased the intensity a bit," said Brodie. "And I think, in the second half, our kids did not want to be denied."

That trapping defense did more than force turnovers (Churchill had 10 in the last two quarters). Since Brodie had shuffled so many players into the game in the first half — "partially because I didn't think anyone was playing all that well, so I kept rotating until I found someone," he said — his starters were rested.

When they got into the game in the second half, with a more focused attitude, it took a toll on Churchill.

"Their half-court trap hurt us a little bit," Lang said. "But the big thing was they were fresher. When they went to that half-court trap, we didn't take care of the ball the way we should have, we didn't move (the ball) inside the way we should have. I think what all that stems from is — we were tired."

Morris ended up as the game's high scorer with 14 points. Ethan Jerome added eight for Churchill, which ended its season at 7-15. Salem (19-3) got 12 points from Adam Hammons, 10 from Joe Measel and nine apiece from James Head and Doug Herriman. Head was the Rocks' leading rebounder with nine.

"Had it been a three-quarter game, we could have won it," Lang said. Perhaps so.

Mercy students to present 'Annie Oakley' musical

Students at Mercy High School in Farmington Hills are learning about the historical Annie Oakley as they prepare to present the classic Irving Berlin musical — "Annie Get Your Gun" — Friday-Sunday, March 18-20.

America's most famous markswoman was immortalized in Berlin's 1946 Broadway musical and the 1956 movie starring Ethel Merman.

But some say the Annie Oakley of stage and screen bears little resemblance to the real-life Annie, who starred in Buffalo Bill Cody's Wild West Show in the 1880s and 90s.

The Mercy production will attempt to present a more accurate characterization of Annie and the play's other characters, who include Annie's husband and manager Frank Butler, Sitting Bull, and Buffalo Bill Cody.

"Annie Get Your Gun" is an outstanding musical with one of the best scores in musical theater, but after 50 years it has become dated," said Roberta Campion, producer/director of the Mercy production.

"We found that some of the language used in the script is sexist and racist," she added. "We wanted to revise our production to make it acceptable to an audience in 1994, and we found we could do that just by making it more historically accurate."

Campion enlisted the aid of Oakley's great-niece, Bess Edwards, president of the Annie Oakley Foundation in Greenville, Ohio, where Oakley was born. Edwards is committed to restoring Annie's legend to historical accuracy and preserving it for future generations.

"Annie was not the brash, uneducated tomboy that Ethel Merman created on the screen," said Edwards. "She was actually very modest and refined. She was also one of the most famous women of her time and one of the best loved."

Now is the perfect time to revisit the legend of Annie Oakley, says Campion. Oakley — born Phoebe Anne Mosey in 1860 — was inducted into the National Women's Hall of Fame in 1993. Next month, the U.S. Postal Service will issue an Annie Oakley stamp as part of its new Legends of the West series.

"Annie Oakley is a superb role

model for young women," said Edwards. "Despite extreme poverty and severe childhood abuse while living in a foster-type home, Annie resolutely faced contemporary prejudice and severe physical setbacks in her struggle to succeed."

"She was self-reliant. She campaigned for women's rights to hold paid employment, earn equal

pay, and participate in sports. She set a fine example for women, and helped change the American public's mind regarding appropriate sports and activities for women."

Between 1885 and her death in 1926, Edwards said Oakley proved herself an outstanding athlete in trapshooting competition and shooting exhibitions.

"As the first well-known wom-

en sport shooter, she opened shooting ranges and matches all over the U.S. and Europe to women competitors."

Oakley also helped women in other ways. "She was widely known for her philanthropic work, especially for helping orphans, widows, and young women who wanted to further their education," Edwards said.

"In our production, we are

working toward creating a character — played by senior Kathryn Hansz — who is nimble, loving and kind," said Campion, "but we have not changed the story line of Frank's male pride. If we did that, the play would not be. But we do intend to let the real Annie Oakley come through."

"Producing Annie Get Your Gun has allowed us to celebrate this extraordinary American woman and also to learn some-

thing about her life and times," adds Campion. "We are very grateful for the help Bess Edwards has given us and for her willingness to share her knowledge with us."

Edwards will present a lecture on Annie Oakley for the show's cast, crew and orchestra on Thursday, March 17. She also will attend opening night.

Cellular Phone In A Dependable Car Enhances Driver Security

Highway crimes, most notably car-jackings and drive-by shootings, are challenging law enforcement officials. A motorist is highly visible and vulnerable in his or her vehicle.

Safety devices available on new cars should go a long way toward reducing traffic accidents and personal injuries. But there's another type of risk a driver faces, the danger of personal attack when the vehicle is disabled. Under such circumstances, at the side of the road, at a stop light or even in a parking lot, a driver is very vulnerable. This is when the "good Samaritan" who claims to offer assistance may have more devious motives.

Another potential danger to anyone in a disabled vehicle is severe weather, where prolonged exposure to the elements can be life threatening.

Whatever the situation, a dependable vehicle and personal security go hand-in-hand.

Car Care Council lists the five most common causes of breakdowns on the road:

- *Out of gas
- *Engine stalls/won't start
- *Dead battery
- *Flat tire
- *Overheating

All of the above are avoidable with common sense preventive mea-

sures, says the Council. These include:

*Regular inspection of tires to spot damage, unusual wear or under inflation that can lead to tire failure;

*A seasonal check and preventive maintenance of the cooling system, a frequent factor in roadside breakdowns;

*Periodic mechanical check-ups, especially when engine stalling, hard starting or other such symptoms signal trouble ahead;

If you are stranded, try to move your car to a safe location on the side of the road out of traffic. Turn on your emergency flashers. If at all possible, stay inside your car with the doors locked until help arrives.

A cellular phone is the best way to call for roadside assistance, concludes the Council.

TIP: Watch the gas gauge. Get in the habit of keeping the tank at least half full at all times, not only to prevent running out of fuel but also to prevent condensation in the tank. Moisture in gas lines can freeze, causing the engine to stall.



Maintaining A Showroom Shine

Besides the first robin, a sure sign of spring is seeing your neighbor armed with a bucket of suds and pile of rags washing the family car in the driveway. Not only is this a great way to enjoy the warmer weather, but the efforts to maintain a vehicle's exterior will pay off when you sell it. The first thing a potential buyer notices is a sharp exterior, evidence of a well-maintained car. No exterior will last forever, but there are steps you can take to substantially lengthen the lifespan of your car's finish.

The best way to keep the exterior of your vehicle looking new is to wash it frequently, preferably by hand. Consider the quality of your local water; if you have "hard" water, rings and film may be left on your car's surface. Because it is difficult to change the water supply, the next best thing is to dry the car before the water can evaporate.

Don't use detergent or common coarse soaps. Harsh detergents cause your car's paint to lose its residual oils. Use a nondetergent soap made especially for waxed surfaces or a liquid soap used for dishwashing by hand. Be sure the soap is diluted to the proper strength. In warm weather, wash in the shade with cold water, in cooler air, use warm water.

Use a nozzle with as much pressure as possible to dislodge dirt. Be sure to rinse the car thoroughly. Start washing your car from the top and work down. Abrasive dirt tends to flow down and away from surface parts. The best washing tool is a sponge, a car-wash mitt, or a soft towel. Whichever you use, keep it clean by rinsing frequently or replace it when it becomes dirty.

Protect the vehicle's finish by parking in a garage or under a roof whenever possible. Avoid parking under trees, as sap and bird droppings may damage the finish. If your vehicle is exposed to pollen or bird droppings, especially in hot and sunny weather, wash it as soon as possible. Do not allow spilled gasoline, antifreeze or windshield washer fluid to remain on your vehicle's finish.

Rinse your car with clear, cold water. Even clean rinse water can leave obvious water spots which may be difficult to remove. A soft terry towel is best for drying the car. A chamois will work well, but it can also drag dirt particles along with

the water. Start drying at the top and work your way down.

Some areas of your car may require special attention. For instance, vinyl tops should be washed frequently using a brush and vinyl protective spray. Not only will regular cleaning safeguard the top from sun and pollution, it will allow you to inspect it for tears. Vinyl cleaners, not wax, should also be used on any rubber trim on your car's exterior. Don't neglect windshield wiper blades where motor oil residue can build up and reduce effectiveness. Wash your wheels and tires last by spraying water up inside the wheel wells and under the rocker panels where salt and debris may get trapped and cause rust.

A wax finish will remove harmful deposits from the vehicle's surface and help protect the finish. For best results, work in the shade or your garage. Always apply the wax to the pad, not to the car. Do not wax for the first 60 days after purchasing your car while its finish is especially fresh.

No matter how much you try to keep your car's exterior looking good, it's almost impossible to avoid chips and scratches. Automobile manufacturers have been expanding their efforts to maintain the beauty of your new vehicle after it has left the showroom. Ford Motor Company, for instance, instituted the "Nice Touch" program as part of its owner follow-up plan. According to Dwight Reed of Ford Customer Service Division, more than 2,000 Ford and Lincoln-Mercury dealers nationwide mail out a half-ounce tube of touch up paint to new car buyers within 30 days after a purchase. The lacquer automotive refinishing paint, an exact match to the owner's new vehicle, is an easy way to deal with knicks and scratches.

Pollution, effects of harsh weather, door dings, and even oxidation - exposure to air, are hazards every vehicle faces once it leaves the showroom. By taking the time to care for the exterior of your vehicle, you'll be able to minimize these threats to its finish. Not only will a well maintained exterior pay off during trade-in, but driving is much more enjoyable until that time.

Ignore Car Care And Face Consequences

"Reactionary Maintenance" Abounds

You have probably heard your dentist say, "If you ignore your teeth they will go away."

Without proper dental hygiene and regular visits to the dentist, it is very likely that someday you will be soaking your teeth instead of brushing them. The same thing can be said about your car. If you deny your car proper preventive maintenance and avoid regular car trips to a good technician, then, like your teeth, your car will go away.

Up until the mid 1970s, most car owners practiced preventive maintenance. This was largely due to the fact that as the ignition points wore out and lead in the fuel masked the spark plug, vehicle performance and economy began to deteriorate very noticeably. The car would then be brought in for the proverbial "tune-up". This tune-up usually took place about once a year or every 12,000 or 15,000 miles.

This was also a good opportunity for the technician to check for additional maintenance needs in areas such as the radiator and heater hoses, and coolant condition, the fan belts, the vacuum hoses, the fuel and air filters, the canister filter and the condition of the battery, the tires and the emission control and exhaust systems, just to name a few.

With the advent of electronic ignition and unleaded fuel in the mid 1970's, as well as the addition of computer controls in the early 1980's, the deterioration of the cars' performance and mileage is hardly noticeable. This, combined with the fact that there are very few full service gas stations left today (full service meaning that there is a knowledgeable person on hand to check under your hood as a form of preventive maintenance while filling the tank), causes most vehicle owners to practice what is called "reactionary maintenance".

Reactionary maintenance is when you continue to drive your car as long as it runs well, neglecting to raise the hood to check the oil or anything else. Then, the first time you notice a change in drive-ability, usually at 50,000 to 60,000 miles,

you rush to a repair facility and want the problem fixed in a couple of hours.

And you often complain about the cost of repairs. It may sound a little harsh, but this scenario happens thousands of times each day across the country.

Today's cars need regular, preventive maintenance. Even though oil and gasoline have improved, and car manufacturers will try to persuade you that their product has improved, new cars still wear out. Actually, new cars are wearing out faster than old ones due to the lack of preventive maintenance.

If you want your car to last as long as the payments, dig the owner's manual out of the glove box. Turn to the "Maintenance Instructions" section and read it carefully. Pay particular attention to the page which discusses oil change intervals. You will note that the manufacturer differentiates between "normal driving conditions" and "severe driving conditions".

Usually, severe driving conditions are defined as: driving through dusty areas, towing a trailer or boat, frequent idling or idling for long periods, and driving for 10 miles or less in freezing weather. Cars operated under these conditions should have an oil and filter change every 3,000 miles or three months, whichever ever occurs first.

Normal driving conditions occur if your driving does not fall in any one of the severe driving categories. However, less than 25 percent of the cars on the road actually qualify for the normal driving category. In addition, if your car is equipped with a turbo-charger, frequent oil changes are a must.

If the turbo becomes coked up, it could cost as much as \$1,000 to replace it, and the factory warranty won't cover the bill if you can't show proof of oil changes at the factory-recommended intervals.

Engine coolant and transmission fluid are two more items that must be changed regularly to ensure a long life for your car. Engine coolant should be changed every two years and diluted with 50 percent water, as pure engine coolant will freeze at around 0 degrees Fahrenheit. This mix gives you the best cold weather protection and the best heat dissipation ability in hot weather.

The life of the automatic transmission fluid is basically determined by how hot the fluid has been during operation. (See the chart.) Since you have no way of really knowing how hot the fluid has been, an easy way to check is by pulling out the

transmission dipstick and looking at the fluid. If the fluid is brown instead of red and smells like you just ran over a skunk, it needs to be changed ASAP! It is a good habit to have the transmission fluid changed every two years or 24,000 miles.

The high temperatures under the hood of today's cars take their toll on rubber and neoprene components such as radiator and heater hoses, fuel lines, and vacuum hoses. One of the main causes of breakdown is fan belt and/or radiator/heater hose failure. The best insurance against this catastrophe is to have the belts and hoses replaced every two years.

And while on the subject of rubber, I shouldn't forget to mention

your car before it leaves you stranded, or pay a service call and a new battery plus the inconvenience of being stranded? The fact is, preventive maintenance is cheaper in the long run than reactionary maintenance. The question that often remains is: "Where do I get the money for preventive maintenance?" Most people budget only for car payments, insurance, and gas.

All that really needs to be done is to keep close track of the miles you drive each week. Set aside ten cents for each mile that you drive and place this money in an interest bearing account.

At the end of one year, if you

Automatic Transmission Fluid Oxidation

Automatic transmission fluid provides 100,000 miles of service before oxidation occurs under normal operating temperatures of about 170°F. Above normal operating temperatures, the oxidation rate doubles; useful life of fluid is cut in half with each 20°F increase in temperature.

The approximate life expectancy at various temperatures is as follows:

175°F	100,000 miles	315°F	750 miles
195°F	50,000 miles	335°F	375 miles
212°F	25,000 miles	355°F	180 miles

This information clearly shows why transmission oil coolers and the various maintenance intervals are recommended for severe usage.

Above 300°F, the metal inside the transmission will warp and distort in varying degrees depending on the severity of overheating. Because this damage occurs and fluid life is so seriously impaired, rocking out of snow, mud or sand should never exceed a very few minutes.

the tires. There is no reason why steel belted radial tires shouldn't last at least 70,000 miles or longer. It takes only three things to make this happen. 1) Have wheel alignment and tire balance checked once a year. 2) Keep tires properly inflated and check weekly. 3) Rotate tires every 6,000 miles.

Perhaps the key is to examine the tires once a week. If you notice any unusual tire wear patterns, have a good alignment shop check the alignment, the suspension components, and the tire balance. Tire wear problems do not fix themselves.

One final area which I would like to discuss is the battery. Most batteries are replaced on the first cold morning that the car won't start. The average life of a battery is three and one-half years. If you are driving around with a battery that is older than that, then you shouldn't be surprised if you are stranded at the train station parking lot or the shopping center when it is 10 degrees below zero and the wind is blowing at 20 m.p.h.

Why not just replace the battery before this happens? That is what preventive maintenance is all about: looking, checking, and replacing automotive components before they fail.

You are probably thinking to yourself that preventive maintenance is too expensive to follow. On the contrary, would it be more expensive to replace the battery in

have driven 15,000 miles, you will have saved \$1,500 to spend on preventive maintenance. That will buy a lot of maintenance. Any money left over can either be left in the account to let your balance grow, or can be put towards the principal of your car loan. This will reduce both the interest you are paying as well as the number of payments.

Your car is a major investment, so why not take care of it? If you borrow \$16,000 to purchase a car at 14 percent interest, and you pay this off over a period of four years, you will eventually pay almost \$5,000 in interest. That's \$21,000 that you pay out of your budget in a four year period.

If you practice preventive maintenance, your car will outlast your payment book. Then, if you keep your car for another four years and make those same car payments to yourself, you will have \$21,000 to spend. I don't know about you, but I could think of all kinds of neat toys to buy.

Remember it is cheaper to look at, check, and replace components before failing than it is to drive your car until it drops. If you are not fixing your own car, there are thousands of repair facilities across the country that are very capable of performing the preventive maintenance which I have discussed in this article. Give preventive maintenance a try, and you will find yourself with money in your pocket.

Choosing Gasolines

Does higher octane premium gas mean more detergents to keep your engine healthy? Not necessarily, says the Car Care Council. In most cars premium gas adds up to wasted money and resources.

For people who believe they're doing their cars a disservice by using less expensive "regular" gas, the Council states that all grades contain engine-cleaning detergents, and most cars seldom need more than a good quality of regular, 87-octane fuel.

Exceptions to the rule:

- An older engine that has accumulated carbon in the combustion chamber, causing knocking or ping- ing under load. Higher octane can help, but sooner or later a more radical procedure may be necessary to remove carbon.

- Mechanical problems, sometimes due to a vacuum leak, overheating or emissions control system malfunction. Remedy: diagnose and correct the trouble.

- The engine needs attention. Remedy: have the engine diagnosed and serviced as required.

- The vehicle is designed for higher octane fuel. Remedy: use recommended grade of fuel.

Besides the cost factor, high-octane gas requires more crude oil per gallon to produce. It also creates more toxic hydrocarbons, something the ozone could do without.

So the next time you're debating at the pump and decide to give your car a treat with some expensive, higher octane gas, remember that a better investment of your money may be in routine preventive maintenance services.

An Added Springtime Ritual: Change The Oil, Recycle The Filter



Springtime. Time to shake the winter doldrums. Whether you have traveled great distances over the winter or stayed home by the fire, it's important to make sure you perform a thorough inspection of your vehicle before heading out on a family vacation.

"Many times people neglect their vehicles over the winter due to the cold or the belief that the car is fine because they didn't use it that much," explains Gary Donahue, lead trainer for AlliedSignal Automotive Aftermarket. "However, sludge can build up in the engine and cause expensive problems down the road. The quickest, and easiest, way to avoid this problem is installing fresh oil and a quality oil filter."

Easy To Do

Changing the oil and filter isn't very complicated. Donahue explains that on many cars, the oil drain plug is easily accessible and can be removed without having to raise the vehicle. Likewise, the oil filter is easily accessible and can be removed either by hand or with an oil filter wrench.

"Any pan or basin with a capacity of a couple of gallons will give you plenty of room to handle the four to six quarts of oil contained in most engines," Donahue explains. "You get it to come out by simply unscrewing the oil drain plug from the oil pan at the bottom of the engine counterclockwise. It's always best to take the car for a short ride to warm the oil before removing. This will make it flow easier."

Once you've changed the oil, be sure the drain plug is in place, and add fresh oil. Make sure you use a quality oil. A quick check of your owner's manual will give you the recommended weight and quantity for your driving conditions.

Most oil filters on cars today are a spin-on unit. They can easily be removed by hand or using a filter wrench according to Donahue. After removal, make sure the oil filter base of the engine where you'll be installing the new filter is wiped clean. Then, before you screw the filter into place, coat the gasket with clean oil. Once the gasket contacts the base, tighten it according to manufacturer's instructions.

With the new filter in place, check the dipstick to be sure there's enough oil. Start the car and let it idle. Check for leaks while it's running, then check the dipstick again. You may need to add oil to make up for the amount that was pumped into the new filter.

You're almost done. With one major exception—what do you do with the old oil and oil filter?

Clean-up/Recycle

Properly disposing of the used oil and oil filter is not only critical to protecting the environment, it's being regulated in many states as landfills are becoming overcrowded. Recycling only 20% of all filters produced annually will:

- save nearly 400,000 cubic yards of landfill space;
- remove several million gallons of oil from landfills; and
- recycle more than 34,000 tons of filter scrap which can be used to produce steel products.

Proper Steps

After you drain the oil, put it in a recyclable container that you can easily transport in your car to the recycling center. This can be a container made especially for oil changes, an old plastic liter/soda bottle or other container that can be sealed to avoid spillage.

Once you've removed the old filter, and initially drained it of used oil into your collection pan:

- Drain the filter over an oil collection pan for approximately 12 hours to remove all free-flowing oil.
- Put the oil from the filter into the plastic jug containing the oil from your car.
- Place the used oil filter in a leak-proof bag or container and transfer it, along with the used oil, to the nearest designated recycling facility.

The used oil and filter should be taken to your nearest recycling center that accepts used motor oil. Designated locations for recycling may be a local municipal drop-off recycling center, a municipal garage or a business providing oil change services. Some of these facilities may also accept your used filter.




