

Amormino's 7-year-old son, Mike, will be a second-grader at the Monroe Developmental Academy when it opens Sept. 22, she said. Her 5-yearold twin daughters, Nicole and Elaine, will be entering kindergarten. They were among 249 students,

ages 5 to 13, who beat Friday's open enrollment deadline, although the tuition-free charter school will continue to accept more pupils.

Amormino is encouraged that the student-teacher ratio at the charter school will be 15 to 1. That compares to a 28-to-1 ratio last year in her son's class at the public Monroe Elementary School in Wayne, she said.

"I think that's going to make a great difference," she said. The charter school is slated to open

in the former Titus Elementary School, 300 Henry Ruff south of Cherry Hill. The school was part of

the Wayne-Westland public school district until last spring, when it was closed.

A \$495,000 purchase agreement has been reached between Wayne-Westland officials and financial backers for the charter school, which will be headed by former Wayne-Westland principal Chuck Stockwell.

The two sides haven't closed on the sale, officials said, but no major hurdles are expected.



Salesman, 56, charged with embezzling

A Westland lumber company salesman is charged with bilking his employer of \$32,000 by charging expensive trips to Florida and New York City, stays in plush hotels, meals at fine restaurants and purchases at upscale clothing stores, a police sergeant said.

Thomas Jude Chaplow, a former Weyerhaeuser Co. sales representative, could face 10 years in prison if convicted of living a lifestyle of luxury by embezzling with a company-issued American Express credit card.

The card was supposed to be used only for purposes related to his corporate expense account, Westland police Sgt. Dan Harvey said.

Chaplow, 56, of Sterling Heights, was ordered to stand trial for embezelement in a ruling Thursday by Westland 18th District Judge C. Charles Bokos. The decision came af-

Meals out accounted for \$3,418.75 of the credit card charges, Harvey said, referring to allegations in the warrant.

Limousines were rented at company expense, Harvey said. Airline flights, tickets to entertainment events and car repairs were also charged, the sergeant said.

Under company policy, employees aren't supposed to use expense accounts for personal business or for out-of-state travels that aren't approved by superiors, Harvey said."

Allegations that Chaplow embezzled from Weyerhaeuser emerged after company officials began to question expense reports that either weren't turned in or that were incomplete, Harvey said.

The Observer left a message on Chaplow's telephone answering machine on Thursday, but didn't receive a return call.

A not-guilty plea had been placed on record for him prior to his court appearance on Thursday. He remains free after posting \$1,000, or 10 percent of a \$10,000 bond.

Shooting incident nets man a 2-year prison term

A Westland man who fired a 12-gauge shotgun at his estranged wife's companion has been sentenced to a two-year prison term on a felony firearms charge.

Robert John Beard, 33, also has been placed on probation for five years for assault with intent to do great bodily harm, reduced from earlier charges that he tried to kill the man.

Beard was sentenced Tuesday by Detroit Recorder's Court Judge Gershwin Drain after pleading no contest to the two charges on July 31, averting a trial.

He was charged after he fired a single shot at a 48-year-old man who accompanied his estranged wife to her residence on Ackley,

near Palmer and Wildwood, Westland police Sgt. Tom Kubitskey has said.

The bullet missed the victim during the incident that occurred at 3 a.m. Nov. 17 in a residential neighborhood.

Beard could have faced a maximum of 10 years in prison for the shotgun assault, but the more lenient sentence followed a plea agreement arranged by prosecuting and defense attorneys.

Beard and his wife had separated prior to the shooting attempt. but he had returned to the house and was waiting inside when she and her companion, a co-worker, arrived, police have said.

Neither the wife nor her companion was seriously injured dur-

ing the incident.

At one point, Beard allegedly forced his wife to tie up the man, who was later able to break free and assist the wife in overpowering Beard, according to original reports of the incident. Police were then called to the house.

Before he was overpowered, Beard fired a single shot at the wife's companion, who dove to the

floor to avoid being hit, Kubitskey has said.

Last week, Beard had been. scheduled for a trial that was averted by his July 31 plea. The case had been sent to Recorder's Court after Beard voluntarily walved a preliminary hearing in-February in Westland 18th District Court.







Not everyone is convinced that children will receive a superior education at the charter school. Just last week, Wayne-West-

land school board president Francis "Bud" Winter cautioned that if he were a parent contemplating sending a child to the charter school, he would wait for one year to see whether it proves successful.

Public officials have another reason for being less than supportive toward the charter school, and they have been vocal about it. For each child who leaves the Wayne-Westland district to attend the Monroe Developmental Academy, \$5,500 in state dollars will follow them.

To be sure, not all charter school students will be coming from Wayne-Westland. The academy has also appealed to parents in other districts, such as Garden City and Inkster, to boost enrollment.

Hoffe said she is pleased that 249 students have enrolled at the charter school.

"I didn't think we would get that many," she said. "I was a little scared.'

Charter officials had earlier hoped to secure a deal with Wayne-Westland officials to use the former Monroe Elementary School, which also closed in the spring.

Altogether, four of 21 Wayne-Westland elementaries closed because sixth-graders are being moved to middle schools under a restructuring plan that will result in smaller elementary enrollments.

Public school officials decided not to lease or sell Monroe Elementary for now, saying that new residential development could result in a need for additional classroom space in the area.

Advantages seen

Amormino said she is sending her children to the charter school, in part, because her fast-learning son didn't seem to get enough individual attention in the public school system.

At the charter school, students will be grouped not by age, but by developmental needs. Students may progress at their own pace and stay in ungraded instructional unit for as little as eight weeks or as long as three years.

The charter school will use the state's core curriculum, Amormi-

no said, and parents are being encouraged to come into the classroom to help their children.

"I'm more than welcome in the classroom to help out," she said.

Parents will be responsible for getting their children to and from school, which will be in session from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. But Amormino noted that a latchkey program will be operated before and after school to help working parents.

Stockwell has been working to hire certified teachers for the Monroe Developmental Academy. A developmental optometrist giso will be on-site on certain days to. help students with vision problems.

The Dorsey Center summer day camp wouldn't be possible each year without dedicated high school students who volunteer their time and are so very. committed to the youngsters these boys have meant that meet there each day.

Hospital holds dedication for new emergency center

he new emergency center at St. Mary Hospital is getting ready for full operation in September.

The center was dedicated last Tuesday and then a community open house was held on Sunday.

The Most Rev. Walter J. Schoenherr, auxiliary bishop of the Detroit Archdiocese, blessed the center during ceremonies Tuesday.

The \$3.8 million project was designed by Albert Kahn Associates of Detroit and built by Barton-Malow of Southfield. St Mary is at Five Mile and Levan and draws many patients from Garden City and Westland.

With new Prompt Care Services, additional space and direct access from Levan Road, the center has the capacity to accommodate more than 35,000 emergency visits a year.

The design of the new Emergency Center reveals a modern, expanded facility with more convenient access from Levan. The new center at about 17,000 square feet has about double the space of the former emergency facility.

Patients will be directed to the Triage Area for assessment after entering through the wheelchair-accessible revolving door or ambulance entrance. Three registration areas will be staffed two traditional emergency center registration areas and a Prompt Care registration area for patients with minor injuries or illnesses.

A family waiting area near the front of the center and a children's waiting area with scaleddown furniture, a TV and VCR are available for family members and visitors.

Individual treatment areas feature sliding glass doors that will provide increased privacy for patients and visibility for physicians and staff. The center includes four trauma areas, four exam/treatment areas, six observation/treatment areas, three beds designated as the chest pain center, and five prompt-care treatment areas. A privately located family quiet room also is available.

Other areas will be equipped for isolation, decontamination, paramedic/police, radiographic (X-ray) room, and orthopedics (casting).

The Prompt Care area specializes in the rapid evaluation and treatment of patients with minor illnesses and injuries. Specific criteria are used to determine which patients are directed to Prompt Care.

Since many patients who arrive at the Emergency Center are suffering from chest pain, three of the center's observation/treatment areas are equipped to provide rapid evaluation of undiagnosed chest pain. The chest pain center in the new emergency center provides state-of-the-art cardiac diagnosis, monitoring and treatment.

New signs highlight the entrance to the center, and parking is close to the center entrance. Renovations have resulted in an additional 110 parking spaces.

'Completion of the new Emergency Center is the first phase of a \$36 million construction project to help St. Mary Hospital achieve its mission of 'building the future' and responding to the health needs of the community," said Sister Mary Renetta, executive vice president and administrative liaison for the project.

The expansion project includes a two-story West Addition that will be home to a maternity center featuring labor, delivery, recovery and postpartum rooms, a state-of-the-art surgical suite and a new Women's Center.

The West Addition is scheduled for completion in spring 1997.

A new pavilion entrance, to be finished in November 1995, is being built at the south end of the hospital.

Clark Durant nudged Michigan education a step closer to parochiaid as a split State Board of Education endorsed a new definition of "public schools."

Durant, R-Grosse Pointe, won 5-2 approval Aug. 16 of proposed governance changes that now go to the Legislature. The recommendations face trouble in the House of Representatives, where many Republicans and most Democrats are protective of public schools.

"Much too broad," objected Dorothy Beardmore, R-Rochester, the lone Republican to fight Durant on the board. Current law defines public schools as school districte, intermediate districts and public school academy corporations.

The new draft would redefine a public school by its "mission" of teaching academic skills. It's close to the definition pushed by Teach Michigan, a group that openly favors striking the antiparochiaid section of the Michigan Constitution and allowing state-paid vouchers to be used by parents at any school, public, private or church-related.

Said Beardmore: "As long as their mission focuses on whatever their mission was, they can go ahead" with assurance of state money, "But how does their approach meet state standards?"

Beardmore said the Durantbacked code assumes public money "belongs to the family or student, It's a terrible blending of private and public money. It's not legal, constitutional or ethical. It's a back-door entrance to viewing the foundation grant (state

school aid) as a voucher."

Barbara Roberts Mason, D-Lansing, who joined Beardmore in opposing the new draft, criticized Durant, the board president, for stacking the discussion with backers of charter schools. "I would like to hear three additional people with other viewpoints," she said after hearing Durant's hand-picked speakers, including former Milwaukee superintendent Howard Fuller.

Durant, an attorney and conservative GOP figure elected to the board in 1994 with religious right backing, had his votes lined up and mostly let opponents talk without rebuttal. Voting his way were Republicans Gary Wolfram of Hillsdale, Marilyn Lundy of Detroit, Sharon Wise of Owosso and Ruth Braun of Saginaw. Wolfram and Braun are appointees of Gov. John Engler.

A bone of contention was the charter school concept, also called PSAs for public school academies. Current law allows a limited number for academies to receive charters from universities and state foundation grants while operating largely outside the domain of local elected school boards.

Durant's forces support PSAs with ideology: "choice," "competi-tion" and "freedom." Opponents said PSAs should first be tested. and researched.

Fuller, a rumored candidate for Michigan's open superintendent of public instruction job, bluntly urged Michigan to charter an unlimited number of academies, even though "it's too early to analyze" their success in Milwaukee in his tenure.

Opponents said PSAs should

be considered experimental until research proves their value.

"It is indeed too early to make any analysis of charter schools in Milwaukee," said Mason.

Said Beardmore: "Before we rush to create more PSAs, we should find out what their successes are and what their challenges are. This has not been thought through," she added, calling Fuller's advice "foolhar-

Public comments consumed two hours of the board's morning meeting.

"Durant's rhetoric does not match his true meaning," said Joan Donnell, Blomfield Township mother of two. She blistered Durant for forcing the resignation of state superintendent Robert Schiller Aug. 3. "Dr. Schiller wanted to improve public education in this state, not dismantle it," she said.

"Let charter schools ride their course before we jump ahead to home rule," said Dirk Koorstra, a Zeeland teacher. He warned that smaller "autonomous" schools advocated by Durant "can be controlled by special interests."

Julius Maddox, Pontiac teacher and president of the Michigan. Education Association, urged a "sound, researched-based" approach. Maddox said both parties in the Legislature supported core curriculum standards, school accreditation and proficiency tests, and cautioned against "a radical course of change.

Barbara DeMarco, West Bloomfield parent representing People for the American Way, said Durant's agenda is "the destruction of public education."

She called "choice" and "freedom" mere "buzzwords."

Julie Dennis, a Rockford teacher, urged research before adoption of "unfounded proposals."

Besides Fuller, one of Durant's chosen speakers was Chuck Stockwell, a 16-year veteran of the Wayne-Westland School District before he left to start a charter school. Stockwell accused the local board of trying to frustrate his group's effort by taking vacant school buildings off the market.

"The department (of education) must become proactive and educate superintendents," Stockwell said. "We've made repeated efforts to talk to our local school board - to no avail.'

Stockwell said charter schools face a money hurdle: They can get no state foundation grants until they've been open for three months — at a cost of \$500,000 to \$1 million in operating capital. "Banks won't even talk to us (about start-up loans). We need to issue tax anticipation notes."

He said vacant school buildings, already paid for by taxpayers, should be made available to groups that want to start charter schools. "Waive the fire marshal code," he said. "That building was OK as a public school for 37 years but not as a charter school today.'

Urging "at least 200 charter schools," Stockwell said, "Charter schools could give (educators) freedom to do the job they know they can do."

Beardmore, referring to charter backers criticism of "unnecessary state mandates," said, "I want to know what they are. No one has said what they are."

Ounce of prevention comes in form of immunizations

During Dr. Donald Lawrenchuk's 13 years as medical director of the Wayne County Health Department, one of the saddest and most preventable deaths he documented was that of a little girl who had not been immunized. against measles.

The child's father had signed a personal waiver during the 1989-1991 outbreak which nationwide caused more than 130 deaths, half of whom were young children.

"We're very concerned about the increasing number of people requesting personal waivers," said Lawrenchuk. "There's a certain amount of complacency, particularly today with our busy lifestyles. It's an easy way out.

'Measles is the most contagious disease of mankind, and one of nine diseases that are vaccine preventable. When kids are most contagious is two-three days before we find the child has the disease. They're incubating the disease and passing it on."

All 50 states require schoolchildren to be immunized against measles. Failure to do so can lead

to new outbreaks. If a pregnant It's the law woman contracts German measles, or rubella, she can lose her unborn baby or the baby can be born blind, deaf or mentally retarded.

Now that school bells are about to ring, parents and legal guardians need to check if their children are up to date on the required immunizations of DPT (diphtheria, pertussis and tetanus), MMR (measles, mumps and rubella) and OPV/IPV (polio).

Before the measles vaccine was licensed for use in 1963, the disease struck nearly all children by age 15.

Measles is known to cause serious complications, such as pneumonia and brain inflammations, leading to convulsions, hearing loss and mental retardation. Two of every 1,000 children who catch measles die from it.

Add to the high numbers of children unvaccinated because of waivers, the fact that vaccines on average are only 95 percent effective and you begin to see the dan-

"Currently, there is a pertussis, or whooping cough, outbreak in Wayne County," said Lawren-chuk. "According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention in Atlanta, pertussis levels are at the highest levels in 26 years and for every reported case, 10 go unreported. We normally get weekly reports from schools (during the school year), but those are just the tip of the iceberg.'

State law requires a child, ages 4-6. receive four doses of DPT. If a dose was given on or after the fourth birthday, a booster dose of DPT is required. Most children have five doses. For ages 7-18, if a DPT dose was not given in the last 10 years, a booster dose is required.

Three doses of the polio vaccine ("live" oral or inactivated) are required. If the last dose was not given on or after the fourth birthday, a booster dose is required. Most children will have fourdoses.

Two doses of MMR are required, with the first dose given on or after the first birthday, the second dose at least 30 days after the first, and at or after 15 months of age,

Begining March 6, 1996, even the youngest of children must complete the required immunizations, including HIB (haemophilus influenza — type B) or they will be excluded from attending child care centers, group residences and preschool programs.

The Livonia, Wayne-Westland, Garden City, Plymouth-Canton, Clarenceville, Redford Union and South Redford schools require a record of dosages to be presented at the time of enrollment. State law prohibits a principal or teacher from admitting a child to school without proof of the required immunizations.

The State of Michigan provides a booklet to simplify record keeping. Children who have not

received the immunizations required by state law will be excluded from school on the first day of school.

Controversy over the safety of DPT in the last few years could be the reason parents in greater numbers are signing personal waivers. However, diphtheria is nothing to fool around with. One out of every 10 people who get the disease dies. Tetanus, with complications ranging from convulsions to broken bones, kills three out of every 10 people contracting it. Pertussis, or whooping cough, can be just as deadly.

"In Michigan, we haven't had tic reaction." those problems with DPT because Michigan produces their own vaccines," Lawrenchuk said. "I don't think anyone would dispute there have been cases of death, but the benefits far







mittee chair, has introduced legislation to eliminate the personal waiver or exemption. The bill bassed the House of Representatives last year, but not the Senate. The legislation would not affect the medical or religious waivers. Bankes also is asking the pubhic health industry to take a look at an incentive program for welfare recipients who have their

children vaccinated. With the new budget year starting Oct. 1, she also is looking to appropriate money from the \$2 million public health budget for a statewide immunization registry. According to Bankes, these measures are of the utmost importance because people's lives are at stake.

"It really hit home for me when my secretary thought she had the measles and an aide in my office had a rare blood disease and couldn't be inoculated," Bankes said. "Because one person had not followed up on the second incoulation, the other person's life was threatened."

We're very concerned about the increasing number of people requesting personal waivers. There's a certain amount of complacency, particularly today with our busy lifestyles. It's an easy way out.

College age students as well as young children need to be protected against diseases like measles. The National Foundation for Infectious Diseases also recommends that the three million college students and adults ages 20-37 receive a second measles shot since some may have slipped through the cracks during the time requirements were being phased in.

Michigan is one of 28 states not requiring a measles booster before a student enrolls in college. If you were born in 1957 or later, ask your doctor whether you are immune to measles, or if you should

be vaccinated. It could save your life.

AAA foundation calls for overhaul of driver education

Driver education needs to be 'reinvented," advises a new report from the AAA Foundation for Traffic Safety.

Traditional driver education methods teach teens how to get licenses, but do little to reduce crashes. The AAA Foundation for Traffic Safety recommends that young drivers be taught a broadbased curriculum that focuses more on safe driving attitudes and behavior than on basic skills.

The Novice Driver Education Model Curriculum outline recommendations include: Developing computer software.

- to teach driving basics;
- Improving in-car instruction with more driver feedback;
- Involving parents in the driver education process:
- Using social pressures to foster safe driving attitudes;
- Enacting graduated licensing systems that restrict new drivers to safer times and locations.

The AAA Foundation for Traffic Safety recommends that young drivers be taught a broadbased curriculum.

"We're letting our kids down . . . we're not doing enough, and it's time to do more," said AAA Michigan Vice President Corporate Relations Larry Givens, "Fifteen- to 20-year-olds account for nearly 15 percent of all driver fatalities, but make up only 7 percent of all licensed drivers."

According to Givens, the AAA Foundation for Traffic Safety report supports findings released by AAA Michigan in its study released earlier this year - Portrait of a Young Driver.

Both studies confirm what many have known all along: young drivers are at a much great-

er risk for crash-related death or injury than the general population; driver education efforts must be enhanced to provide more onroad experience; feelings of "invulnerability" among young drivers are responsible for risky behavior behind the wheel and alcohol use among teens is at an all-time high.

"Teen-agers are inexperienced and do not have the ability to perceive risks appropriately, added David Willis, executive director of the AAA Foundation for

Traffic Safety.







"Butter making is in a sense an act of creation, and in declining its rich rewards, whatever our reasons, we fail to complete a ritual that has been in place around the world since prehistoric times.'

I know exactly what Chalmers was referring to in that quote. On vacation a woman next to me in line at Beal's Lobster Pier requested diet mar garine instead of the real stuff to dip her lobster morsels in.

Let's begin by exposing all those faux butters out there. There are about the same number of calories in butter as margarine, but butter lovers tend to eat more butter than margarine eaters do. Sprinkle on butter substitutes contain salt, rice starch, lecithin, annato and tumeric. Natural as these ingredients might be, real butter is closer to nature. A wise man knows when food contains no sugar, no cholesterol and no calories,

it also has no taste.

For the record, yes, I ate my lobster(s) with butter, but relied on the sole little souffle cup (about 2 tablespoons) rather than requesting more. I first cut my lobster (at Beal's it was with my hands) of course, and then dipped my fork (or fingers) in the melted butter and then speared the lobster chunk.

Fat facts

For the record, margarine, like butter, must also contain 80 percent fat, but most margarines are made with refined and hydrogenated vegetable oils. Some might even have additional animal fat.

Real butter is only as good as the cream from which it is made. Anyone who has tasted real, French butter made from Brittany cows knows of what I speak. The cows are fed and milked so the butter making can be coordinated with the first possible transportation to Paris where it is made and sold immediately.

If a trip to the city of romance for butter. sounds a bit indulgent, try locating a pound of Plugra butter, developed by Hotel Bar Foods in America; it is as close as it gets to real French butter in taste and texture. The only place I've been able to find Plugra is J.R. Hirt's in the Eastern Market. Then again, if you're lucky enough to get your hands on some real cream from Guernsey Farms in Northville or Caulder's Dairy in Lincoln Park, you might be able to churn some real good butter all by yourself. Nothing reveals the quality of a cuisine so unmistakably as the fat on which it is based. Bacon arouses memories of the South, olive oil evokes Mediterranean cooking and sweet butter will bring forth memories of fine French foods.

Substituting margarine

Fats tenderize, provide flavor, help bind ingredients together, and produce browning in haked goods. Butter is interchangeable with margarine in most recipes, but real butter should always be used for candy, puff pastry and croissants. Butter margarine blends (60 percent margarine and 40 percent butter) are available and can be used interchangeably.

The best margarine to cook with is corn or soy margarine but other blends made from vegetable oils are acceptable. Because whipped and tub margarine are softer and contain a higher percentage of air, only stick margarines should be used in baking. Reduced calorie products contain 20 percent less fat than butter, and have water and air substituted for fat. Don't use them for baking.

Flavor wise, reduced fat and no fat faux butters and margarine are not a personal favorite. I would rather compromise by eating a little less real butter than giving it up totally for the faux butters any day.

What to watch for in Taste next week:

Recipes with kid appeal.

Turn any meal into a special event with Maine lobster. August is "Maine Lobster Month" and the perfect time to experiment with these tasty crustaceans.

"Lobster is very easy to cook," said Kevin Dean, co-owner of Superior Fish Company in Royal Oak. It's also lower in fats, calories and cholesterol than the skinless white meat of chicken or turkey.

According to a study conducted by the National Institutes of Health, a 3.5-ounce portion of lobster contains just 72 mg. of cholesterol, 98 calories, and 0.1 gram of saturated fat. Maine lobster also contains omega-3, a substance that is believed to reduce the risk of heart disease.

Dean said the most frequently asked question about lobster at Superior fish is - "how do I cook them?"

Lobster can be baked, broiled, steamed, grilled, sauteed, stir-fried, boiled and even microwaved. The two most common ways to cook lobsters are steaming and broiling.

"I like to steam lobster," said

Dean. "You need a big kettle. Put a two inches of water in the bottom of the kettle, and bring it to a rolling boil. Put the lobsters in the pot, make sure the heat stays constant, and begin timing. Cook 10-15 minutes per pound.'

Dean compares the taste of steamed lobster to steamed vegetables. "If you asked people what tastes better, canned or steamed vegetables, they'll say steamed. When you steam a lobster, you're trapping and retaining the flavor." Others prefer the boiling method. To boil lobsters, fill a large kettle 3/4 full of water. The Maine Lobster Promotion Council suggests that you allow 2 1/2 quarts of water for each lobster. Bring the water to a boil.

Put in the live lobsters, one at a time and let the water boil again. Lower the heat, cover the kettle, and simmer about 15 minutes for a 1 to 1 1/4 pound lobster and 20 minutes for a 1 1/2 to 2 pound lobster. When the antennae pull out easily, the lobsters are done. You should be able to easily pierce the meat with a fork.

After you purchase your lobster,

Seghesio Winery is 100 years young

In 1895, Angela and Edoardo Seghesio bought their first grape ranch in Sonoma County, Calif. Known today as the "Home Ranch," it is the site of the original family residence and the first Seghesio winery, which was built in 1902. Seghesio wines are known for quality and value. Chef Brian Polcyn of Muskie's Urban Pier in Auburn Hills gives Seghesio's Sangiovese high marks for its ability to match well with food. The grapes for the Seghesio Sangiovese come from vineyards planted in 1910.

Although Seghesio can boast a 100-year history in the wine business, their bottled wines have only been available via retail and restaurant sales since 1983. It is phenomenal that this wine family was able to persevere through years of bulk wine production, Prohibition, and the Great Depression to launch the Seghesio wine brand. Imagine that prior to Prohibition, California had 700 wineries and today, there are just 800!

When 30-year-old general manager Peter Seghesio recounts the family history, he reminds us that "Wine is our history, our tradition and our way of life." The family kept its vineyards alive during Prohibition by selling grapes to home winemakers (200 gallons were allowed per household) while the winery was closed. When Prohibition was repealed in 1933, the winery reopened, and wine production resumed.

don't run home and fill the bathtub with water. Lobsters are harvested from the icy, salt water of the North Atlantic Ocean. They should be stored in the refrigerator or in a cooler.

"Put a cool, damp cloth or newspapers on top of them," suggests Dean. "If you're storing them in a cooler, put the ice underneath the lobsters."

Cook lobster within a day of purchasing them. If you store them in plastic bags, punch holes in the bag to keep air circulating.

Lobster is available fresh or frozen at many supermarkets and seafood stores. Expect to pay a little over \$7 per pound. Prices will be lower after Labor Day when the demand isn't as high, and before Christmas.

Seghesio wines benefit from grapes grown in established vineyards that Ted guides into wide. "My goal is to make a wine that is accessible when young, yet balanced to age," he emphasizes.

Today's wine consumer can thank the Seghegio family for preserving their sangiovese, barbera, zinfandel and nebbiolo, rather than pulling out the vines during Prohibition. "Although we didn't destroy our vines, we didn't know what we had either," Peter admits. "Most of these varietics



Currently, Seghesio is propagating sangiovese using clean budwood from its own vineyards. The expansion will increase sangiovese plantings to 40 acres, as well as 10 acres of barbera and more aglianico. "We are using St. George rootstock," said Ted, "the original rootstock used by grandpa Seghesio. It's been working for 100 years, so why change now?"

The old-vines sangiovese is known as Chianti Station. Ted explained that in Sonoma County, from Geyserville north to Cloverdale, the railroad stations were named Chianti, Barbera and Asti. The original 10-acre sangiovese planting was adjacent to the Chianti Station.

"We're just getting back to what we started with," claims Peter. "We've had Italian varietals berry perfume.

and zinfandel planted all along. And here we are in our 100th year with our best hillside vineyards planted to those varieties. The next 10 years will bring the most aggressive replanting program this family has ever experienced. We'll plant 140 acres, 50 percent to Italian varieties. CLARIFIED BUTTER

1 pound butter

In a small heavy saucepan, gently heat butter over low heat until completely melted.

Remove butter from heat and set aside. Allow to stand for 10 minutes. This allows the milk solids to settle to the bottom and the salted foam of salted butter to rise to the top.

If butter was salted, using a teaspoon, skim top of melted butter to remove white foam. (Do not discard, use this on vegetables!) Now wipe the spoon clean and skim the pure yellow butterfat from the pan or bowl. Skim until a milky white residue (milk solids) are all that remains.

The pure yellow butterfat can now be reheated and melted for lobster or for making sauce. Be careful because with the salt and milk residue removed, butterfat hardens to rock solid when chilled. It can be kept almost indefinitely covered securely in the refrigerator. Serves 10-12 about 21/2 tablespoons each.

Break shells up as finely as possible. I crush mine in a food processor with the metal blade, but you can pound them (with a mortar and pestle) or run them through a food grinder.

Melt the butter in a heavy saucepan over low heat. Add the crushed shells. Bring the butter to a simmer and remove from heat. Do not allow the butter to boil.

Line a sieve with muslin or cheesecloth and strain the warm butter into a bowl. Makes about 1/2 cup.





Choose a low-fat dressing to flatter your salad



summer fresh crisp greens and bright vegetables need a dressing to flatter them and you. Preserve the lean look with a fresh light salad dressing.

Two tablespoons of a regular dressing can add 100 to 200 calories with 12 to 20 grams of fat. Two tablespoons of a regular bleu cheese dressing has about 16 grams of fat, while the "lite" version has 7 grams of fat. However, 7 grams of fat in the light bleu cheese has the same amount as regular Italian dressing. Read the label, "light" does mean less fat than the original

version, but not lighter on the so-Low calorie, dium. Light of one variety can have the same amount of fat as some other regular dressing. The new food labels make it easier to find dressings that are lower in fat, calories and sodium. A dressing that has little or no fat is labeled fat free or low fat.

A standard serving size is two tablespoons for salad dressings. If the label says fat free, the dressing contains less than one-half gram of fat per serving. Fat-free has nothing to do with sodium amount. If you're keeping track of the sodium, you'll want to look for one that has less than 300 mg in a serving. Of course, there are low sodium and sodium free dressings on the market. One of these would have less than 5 mg of sodium per serving. Low-fat salad dressings

have no more than 3 grams of fat and is low in calories if it contains no more than 40 calories per serving. A low sodium dressing has no more than 140 mg of sodium per serving.

Buying bottled dressings with less fat sometimes means giving up a lot of flavor, so make your own. Instead of mayonnaise, use equal amounts of plain low-fat yogurt and reduced fat mayonnaise. Using reduced fat mayonnaise reduces the fat from 22 grams to 3 grams. To add a little bite to this, add seasonings such as Dijon mustard and lemon juice. For each one-half of dressing, add about one tablespoon Dijon mustard and one-half tablespoon dried herbs. Flavorful dressing can be made using dried or fresh herbs such as, dill, tarragon, rosemary, oregano and basil.

Use the herbs and fresh ground pepper instead of salt.

Vinaigrettes are very popular for dressing a salad. Instead of the usual three parts oil to one vinegar, revise it to one part oil and three parts vinegar, Flavored vinegars such as balsamic, raspberry or tarragon make great dressings. To rid the dressing of fat, don't use oil, just use the flavored vinegar, Rice wine vinegar is a mild flavor that will enhance a salad.

Non-fat buttermilk can be substituted for yogurt in homemade dressings. It is thicker and tangier and makes a moist, creamy dressing for any kind of salad. Fat-free mayonnaise can be blended with a touch of olive oil and a splash of lemon juice which improves both the taste and the texture of the dressing. A dressing from vinegar,

lemon' juice and a little ground pepper or mustard will add lots of flavor. Lime juice, soy sauce, honey and garlic make a sweet sour flavorful dressing.

Always order dressing on the side in a restaurant, then you control the amount. At home, put about a tablespoon of dressing in a large bowl, add your salad and toss lightly to cover the greens. You'll be amazed how little it. takes.

High fat "add-ons" to flavorful greens can make the calories skyrocket. Crumbled bacon, cheese, avocado, olives, marinated vegetables and butter-fried croutons are just a few. Start building your salad and take a look at all the ingredients that add calories, making it a high-calorie food. Coleslaw can also become a "di-

eter's nightmare." Go easy on the

mayonnaise-based dressing. Make a mock Thousand Island dressing by using plain yogurt, a little ketchup and chopped dill pickles, Mock Green Goddess can be made with yogurt, garlic, lots of chopped chives and parsley, lemon juice and minced anchovies, Tomato juice or chopped or pureed tomatoes make an excellent base for a flavorful, lighter dressing.

Cantaloupes become golden jewels

All cantaloupes are muskmelons, but not all muskmelons are cantaloupes! Muskmelons is the proper name for the group of melons which we call cantaloup, honeydew, Persian and Casaba. "Musk" is a Persian word for a kind of perfume. Since ripe melons often have a fragrant odor, so the name developed. Along with watermelon, muskmelon belong to the cucumber or gourd family.

The origin of the muskmelon is uncertain. Some authorities claim the Indian Subcontinent while others claim Africa. The Egyptians and Ancient Romans culti-

vated them. However, the size was much smaller than that seen today. The netted melon called "cantaloupe" in the United States is also known as the nutmeg melon. A half of a two-pound can-

taloupe is 90 percent water. It has 95 calories. There are 825 milligrams of po-

tassium. One serving has 8,61 0 International units of Vitamin A.

Choosing cantaloupe

The stem end should be slightly sunken, smooth and well calloused. Melons that have some of the stem on them were picked before they were fully ripe - they are not as sweet or juicy.

The webbing should be wellraised, coarse, dry and gravish in color. It should stand out sharply over the entire surface of the baked or canned! They can be fromelon. The color beneath the zen, but they are used almost exnetting should be yellow-tinged or not too deep, or over-ripe.

The odor should be musk-like, fragrant and sweet.

Softness at the stem end is often considered a sign of ripeness. However, repeated pressing on the end of an immature melon may also make it soft at the stem end. Ripe melons are heavy for their size.

Ripe cantaloupes should be wrapped in plastic warp, a plastic bag, or a sealed container before being placed in the refrigerator to sion.

Whoever it was who said you can't legislate taste probably took his kids shopping for school clothes.

The battle between youngsters who just know they can't live without the latest (and most expensive) fad gear and parents who know their children need clothes that are durable, affordable and appropriate is worth fighting, says Dr. Robert Butterworth, the child psychologist.

"But we shouldn't approach it as a battle," Butterworth said. "It's an opportunity to parent responsibly and build consumer skills in a generation that will certainly need those abilities."

An important reason is that even grade schoolers are treated differently based on how they're dressed. If they look ready to learn, teachers will expect and get more out of them, according to Butterworth. Novelty items might be all right for playtime, but the classics are still the right thing for the classroom.

So what's "classic" for back-to- Denim rules school 1995? It's a one-word answer: denim.

"You can probably narrow back-to-school fashions down to three key things - texture, layers and shapes," said Amy Knickerbocker, children's area manager at Jacobson's Laurel Park store in Livonia. high level of nutrients as compared to calories. An average 3ounce serving of lean beef contains 183 calories.

- 1 pound beef top round steak, cut ½-inch thick Juice of 1 to 2 lines; (½ cup juice)
- 1 to 11/2 teaspoons garlic salt 1/2 teaspoon pepper
- 1 cup each shredded lettuce and chopped tomato
- ¼ cup each sliced green onion and shredded low fat

Hawley, Szukaitis fill A.D. void

The Wayne-Westland Schools are staying with experienced personnel in its first year of contracting athletic director positions at the high school level.

Two recently retired school district employees, Bill Hawley (Wayne Memorial) and Gerald Szukaitis (Westland John Glenn), were hired last week to run their respective programs for the 1995-96 season.

The jobs are based on 40-week contract with salaries ranging from \$20,000 to \$25,000 per year.

The Wayne-Westland Schools will contract out its athletic director jobs for the 1995-96 season. Bill Hawley returns at Wayne Memorial's A.D., while Gerald Szukaitis was named at John Glenn

> Hawley, who retired after 33 years with Wayne-Westland district, will enter his 25th year as Wayne's A.D.

> He was instrumental in presenting the outside contracting proposal to new superintendent Duane Moore, along with first-year building principals Leo Schuster (Wayne) and Neil Thomas (Glenn). The plan won school board approval in July.

> "The whole idea was to try to separate the athletic directors from the assistant principals duties," said Hawley, who held the dual role. "It had just become overwhelming for me last four or five years.

"Eight districts in our state are doing the same thing (contracting out), and I think many, many others will follow suit. It gives the district the opportunity to utilize people that have experience and do it at a reduced rate. I feel this is a step in the right direction."

Hawley said he will earn "about one-third" of the salary he received last year as a dual administrator.

"A normal work week is not going to happen, but there are going to be peak and down periods," Hawley said. "I'm sure Jerry and I will find that we'll be working a lot more hours, but we don't want to let the kids or the coaches down.

"It also gives us freedom to do" other things along with it."

Szukaitis, meanwhile, put 31 years in the district before retiring as a last June. He was among 180 teachers

who took early retirement buyouts from the Wayne-Westland Schools last June.

He spent 91/3 years as Glenn's A.D. (1982-91). Szukaitis said he will report to Glenn assistant principal Lynn Gregg.

Szukaitis replaces Sharon Downs. who retired from the district in her dual role as an A.D./assistant principal after two years.

"I've got plaques from when I retired from this job four years ago." said Szukaitis, who was interviewed for the Glenn position by a panel of seven administrators. "The job description is that we'll be doing the same thing as before, but there will be no administrative job along with it and the schedule will be flexible."

Szukaitis resides in Hartland with his wife Shelby, who is also employed as a teacher in Wayne-Westland.


The Lutheran High Westland sidelines won't be the same this year without football coach Dennis Tuomi, who retired after nine seasons.



When football fans hear the name "Walter," thoughts of the great NFL rushing leader Walter Payton come to mind.

Second-year Livonia Clarenceville coach Chuck Donaldson hopes that his new Walter will have the same effect on the Trojans as Payton did with the Chicago Bears.

After a 5-4 season vhich saw. Clarenceville's defense dominate its side of the ball, while the offense struggled, Donaldson welcomed freshman Walter Ragland onto the field.

Ragland, who stands six-feet and 180 pounds, is not a newcomer to Donaldson, who coached him in junior high track. The

"He's one of the best athletes I've ever seen and he's so quick, we have to find a way to utilize his speed," Donaldson said, "He looks like he's ready to go. He's so fluent, he kind of reminds me of a young O.J. (Simpson)."

Ragland will move right into the Trojan offensive attack, sharing time at tailback with junior Chris Lakner (5-8, 160) or seeing action at split end. Joining Lakner and Ragland in the backfield is senior fullback Juan Puentes (5.8, 160).

The trio of backs have big shoes

to fill, replacing the graduated Martino Semen, who rushed for 980 yards last season.

Senior Rob Ashton (6-1, 165), who didn't play football last year, steps into the quarterback position vacated by Jon Pauley - one of eight starters to graduate. Ashton will direct a multiple set offense, using mostly an I-formation.

"Rob has good leadership abilities and a lot of athleticism," Donaldson said. "He's the type of player who can make something happen when it doesn't look like anything is there."

Junior Paolo Hernandez, who transferred to Clarenceville late last season, will back up Ashton, solidifying an improved position for the Trojans.

Senior Bryan DeCaire (5-6, 155)

should start at slot back and be a threat both on the ground and through the air. Senior tight end Jon Rose (6-3, 215), last season's leading receiver, should again see the ball coming his way after bulking up over the off-season and adding about 30 pounds.

The offensive line will be led by senior tackle Jon Wyon (6-1, 220) and senior guard Jim Valimont (6-1, 205).

"The offense is definitely better," Donaldson said. "This season will be much more fun because we have an offense to work with."

The Trojans will employ a 5-2 defense, centered by Puentes, who will start for the second straight season at nose guard. He will be flanked by junior Joe Davis (6.0, 185) and sophomore Tim Atkins.

Jon Rose and Jason Dillaha will man the linebacker spots.

"It's crazy to have a 3.5 grade point and get a 17," Reese said. 'The first try is always shaky, but I'll take it again and I feel I can relax.'





Angiulli eyes Worlds

It was 13 years ago when Jeff Angiulli — then only five years old — laced up his first pair of roller skates.

Taken to the local roller rink by his mother, a former roller skater, the young Angiulli quickly learned the intricacies of the sport and began competing at the age of seven.

It was then, with his entire life still before him, Angiulli plotted his goal in skating -to become the best roller skater in the world.

On Nov. 24, Angiulli – now 18 years old — has a chance to achieve that dream at the World Games in Bucaramanga, Colombia. Angiulli will compete against the top three skaters from countries around the globe.

"I gave myself four years to become the world champ after I became world class, and it's been three years," Angiulli said.

The 1995 Plymouth Salem graduate earned his opportunity by winning the bronze medal at the Olympic Sports Festival July 26 in Denver, and then finishing third again at the Nationals Aug. 12 in Syracuse, N.Y.

In all, Angiulli has won 13 medals in his career — the first coming when he was 8 years old — but none would equal a medal from the World Games. "I'm going there to win, but I'll be happy with whatever happens," Angiulli said

"And whatever happens, Angiulli won't consider retire-'ment anytime soon.

""It's just getting to the point now where they are sending me places to compete and paying for me to go," he said. "It's kind of like taking paid vacations."

"He's been my coach for the past two years and he's been excellent," Angiulli said. "Instead of telling you what to do, he lets vou create vour own style. He did, however, teach me how to become more consistent during the routine." Angiulli skates five to six times a week, usually skating at Riverside Arena in Livonia or in Pontiac with Patton.

At the competitions, Angiulli avoids Patton during the skater's pre-competition ritual of getting to the arena early and sitting alone, performing a type of self-hypnosis for about an hour. He then puts his skates on and listens to music through his headphones before stepping onto the rink.

Life after competitive rollerskating won't take Angiulli away from his love. He plans to study marketing and advertising at UM-Dearborn to open his own in-line skate store and indoor skating facility.

"There's just no place to skate around here in the winter time, so I plan on opening a facility, probably located near a college campus," Angiulli said. For now, however, Angiulli is finding plenty of places to



It wasn't uncommon for Monaghan's Irishman of the Year Watters to stagger home from the hall on Farmington Road north of Seven Mile, not from drinking, but from the long hours he put into making sure members were lieved in customer satisfaction," proud of their club.

Watters, 52, a former Redford St. Agatha boys basketball coach in the late 1960s and early '70s. will be missed after passing away from cancer Tuesday, Aug. 8.



he had cancer in June, about the time he was getting ready to return.

Watters poured Watters drinks at the K of C. but more importantly attended to nearly every other job imaginable before going home after his shift, which began around 9 each morning.

As manager, he was in charge of ordering the food each month and helping schedule events in the banquet hall. He was a tidy man, so picking up a broom was common as well.

And yet, that's not where his day began.

Before he would brighten the days of members at the K of C. Watters would get a smile from the senior citizens who regularly had breakfast with him on the other side of the counter at Bates Hamburgers in Livonia.

Watters' wife of 21 years, Jane, didn't even know this until a handful of senior citizens came to the funeral and told her how wonderful her husband was.

"I knew he went up there (to Bates) periodically, but I didn't realize the amount of attention he gave to senior citizens." Jane Watters said.

dren, but he was a father figure to his players.

He coached boys basketball and Jane coached girls basketball. His St. Agatha grade school team won the Catholic Youth Organization title in both '67 and '68. He also has a Class C district trophy from 1971 at their Redford Township home.

Watters had a deep, yet quiet voice when talking to customers. He could pick it up a few notches when talking to referees.

"He had his moments," Jane said. "Tom Ryan and James Walsh, who were very good friends of ours, he'd give them hell also. He was a very gentle


spirit, yet he was in charge, very important to guiding his player along the right path."

About 300 people attended. Watters' funeral at Saint Sabina Catholic Church in Dearborn Heights, where he and his wife were parishioners.

Pat Twomey, a K of C member, knew Watters since the first grade when they attended St. Gregory together.

"If you look up the definition of friend in Webster's Dictionary, and I hope it's 2,000 words long, you can abbreviate it to "Tom,"" Twomey said. "He's the most loyal. true friend I ever met. He loved kids, taught them respect. It's important to win, but he taught. them it's more important to gontribute."

Low-budget comedy wins accolades

Edward Burns doesn't fetch coffee anymore.

Not that long ago the 27-yearold writer, director, and star of "The Brothers M c M u l l e n'' worked as a production assistant for "Entertainment To-

responsibilities included driving a van and getting java for TV honchos.

In town recently to promote his film (which opens Friday at the Main and Maple Theatres), Burns is friendly, unassuming, and pleasantly surprised to find himself in the spotlight.

In a movie he calls "a romantic comedy for guys," his McMullen brothers are three second-generation Irishmen living together temporarily in a Long Island suburb. Each finds himself in a romantic crisis which could change his life forever.

Jack (Jack Mulcahy), the eldest, contemplates an affair. Barry (Burns' character), a young screenwriter, struggles with the commitment question. Patrick (Mike McGlone) must decide between a wealthy fiance or the girl next door while remaining true to himself and his Irish-Catholic faith.

Burns had written a handful of screenplays before deciding to shoot "McMullen" himself, using his connections at "ET" to find technicians. "I stole sound people all the time," he remembers, "and all those interns like myself who were itching to work on a project like this."

resumes and 8 by 10 photos to search through.

If the house in the movie looks realistic, it should. Burns shot over eight months in the family home on Long Island where he and his own brothers shared bathrooms, traded secrets, and got on each other's nerves — just like in the movie.

"McMullen" is based on his own life experiences, though many elements couldn't be further from the truth. The movie's Irish father is a drunkard, a tyrant, and also dead; Burns' supportive real-life father served as executive producer on the film.

With film stock, processing, and equipment rentals, the final bill for the film was around \$25,000, roughly the cost of last year's independent sensation, "Clerks." "McMullen," however, has a different look and attitude. It's more polished technically and doesn't feel it has to knock you out with its cleverness and edge. Some might call it square, oldfashioned, and overly romantic and did when Burns tried to enter it in some festivals.


Opportunity knocked at Sundance, still the premier showcase for low-budget independent films in America. Strong word ofmouth followed the first of four screenings, making "McMullen" the festival's hot ticket.

Soon Burns was besieged by guys in suits all trying to negotiate an exclusive distribution deal. Twentieth Century Fox picked up the film, releasing it under a new division called Fox Searchlight, which will highlight independently made films. Meanwhile, Burns finds himself in an enviable position. He has been given the green light for a picture at Fox while he crisscrosses the country (and soon Europe) to promote his first film.

Burns relucantly subscribes to the movies' belief that everyone has a perfect mate. "I suppose that there is a chance that there is that special someone out there," he says. "We're all wondering if this is the real thing or just a onenight stand."







Adventure to save pandas filmed in China

Filmed in China's remote Himalayan mountain highlands. "The Amazing Panda Adventure," opening Friday, Aug. 25, at metro Detroit movie theaters, follows two young people and their wise old Chinese Guide as they try to find and return a lost baby panda to its mother. Braving hardships and facing unexpected adventures, the two youngsters learn to love and respect pandas as they gain maturity and tolerance for each other.

The film stars Stephen Lang, Yyi Ding and Ryan Slater.

Ryan is 10, and en route to China to visit his father, whom he hasn't seen in two years. Ryan's father Michael (Stephen Lang) is /chael, then run into the dense a naturalist specializing in the conservation of Giant Pandas,

who live exclusively in the bamboo-forested mountains of China. When Ryan arrives in China, he discovers his father is busy and preoccupied with the fate of the preserve. Ryan gamely tries to make the best of things and joins Michael, a Chinese Girl named Ling (Yi Ding) and a Chinese naturalist named Chu (Huang Fei), as they set out into the mountains to check on one of the pandas.

The panda, a mother with a new baby, has been trapped by poachers. As the poachers return to collect their quarry, they are confronted by Michael's group and they shoot and wound Miforce. The panda reserve's rescue helicopter can only airlift the

wounded naturalist and panda, leaving Ryan, Ling and Chu behind for a second trip.

But as they await the helicopter's return, the trio realizes that the poachers have stolen the mother panda's baby, and quickly set off to rescue the little panda and find their way back to civilization.

Ryan begins the trip angry and resentful, but once he finds and cares for the baby panda, he forms a special bond with the roly-poly creature. As the trio of humans and their precious cargo overcome nature and man-made obstacles to return to their home, Ryan grows up and ultimately

earns the respect of his father, gaining greater understanding of Michael's important work. At adventure's end, father and son have helped assure the survival of the little panda and the panda preserve itself.

"The Amazing Panda Adventure" was initiated by documentary filmmaker John Wilcox, who conceived the original story based on his experiences in China. where he shot the first documentary on the elusive Great Panda, telecast in 1984, followed by a second documentary in 1988." Wilcox wrote the original draft of the script.

Among the most beloved ani-

are high on the endangered species list. It is estimated that less than 1.000 of the exotic blackand white creatures are surviving in the wild, exclusively in China. Only a handful of zoos around the world have produced offspring. The famous preserve in Wolong, Sichaun, is successfully breeding pandas, but no more than two cubs a year have been born. The two baby pandas in "The Amazing Panda Adventure," were born in Wolong, which presently has 21 pandas. An adult panda used in the film came from the Wuhan Circus.

The young pandas had six peo-

mals in the world, Giant Pandas ple to care for them: their keeper, researchers and a veterinarian from the Wolong Reserve. The adult panda from the Wuhan Circus had an entourage of eight.

When they weren't turning somersaults, they chewed every. thing in sight and catlike, clawed their way up anything verticle.

"I spent hours mesmerized by them," said associate producer Josie Rosen. "They are funny, cute and cuddly, and they have these compelling eyes that just draw you in."



One reason merchants are cashing in on sales of women's golf

equipment and apparel is as old as time itself — women are physically different than men. They must have equipment tailored to their height, arm length, and upper body strength. Women's golf clubs have shorter and lighter shafts with narrower grips than mens' and even the balls are softer, wound less tight to make them feel lighter.

Manufacturers appreciate that women want to look good on the greens. The female side of the swinging set desires fancier cuts of shirts, shorts, slacks, sweaters and jackets, plus matching hats, gloves, shoes and accessories. Bavarian Village International Ski & Golf, with 12 locations in Michigan, stocks more than 35 styles of women's golf shoes priced between \$29.95 and \$200, according to the Novi-store clothing manager Mary Curry.

"Women's golf has become so strong it's not a male-dominated sport anymore," she pointed out. "Over one third of all golfers are women. At Bavarian Village, we've literally tripled our clothing for women within the last year."
